Schaumburg Airport Update

<u>Schaumburg Regional Airport Event: Hops and Props</u> Schaumburg Regional Airport hosted Hops & Props for the fourth time on Saturday, September 16, 2023. The event provided the community with great craft beer, vintage aircraft, tasty food, and live music. Approximately 670 guests attended the aviation-themed event located in terminal hangar. This year's event was so successful that it broke all previous attendance records. Thank you to everyone who came out to celebrate.

<u>Airport Snow Removal</u> Snow removal planning has started for the 2023/2024 season. Schaumburg Public Works and Airport staff have met and reviewed the annual Snow Removal Procedures. Airport staff will continue to monitor weather with Public Works and NOTAMs will be issued to notify pilots of the field conditions. The Engineering & Public Works Department's goal is to make the Schaumburg Regional Airport safe and accessible for winter operations for aircraft after a storm in accordance with the guidelines.

EPW staff will attempt to clear the runway, main taxiway, and crossovers of the airport to bare pavement within four (4) hours of the end of a snowfall and have the tie-down areas, ramp area of the Fixed Base Operator (FBO), parking lots, and sidewalks cleared of snow within eight (8) hours of the end of a snowfall. Patches of snow and ice may remain on the runway and paved surfaces of the airport during and after storms have passed. Plowed snow may also accumulate adjacent to lights, runways, crossovers, and taxiways. Pilots should be aware that these conditions could be hazardous to aircraft. Public Works will continue to plow 2-3 feet away from all hangar doors and keep taxiway centerlines visible for pilots. Airport tenants must use non-corrosive de-icer, snow blowers, and shovels, as needed, to clear the snow directly next to their hangar doors.

<u>Delta and Echo Hangar Pavement Rehab</u> The Village of Schaumburg received approval on the final engineering of the Delta and Echo Hangar Pavement Project on September 11, 2023. IDOT selected Schaumburg Regional Airport as a test program for Village staff to locally let the project to get construction completed by the end of the year. Staff was able to send out a RFP for construction of the Delta and Echo Hangar Pavement on September 11th and received the proposals on September 25th. There were three proposals submitted.

Due to the quick turnaround time to complete the project before the end of the year, all proposals came in over the 7% threshold required by IDOT. Staff is in discussions with IDOT to determine if the Village can continue to locally let the project or will have to wait for IDOT to complete a letting in early 2024. The project will be moving forward in 2024, and staff will coordinate with the Delta and Echo hangar tenants about moving their aircraft if they plan on flying during the construction phase.

<u>Schaumburg Regional Airport Event: Santa's Flight to Schaumburg</u> Schaumburg Park District will be hosting Santa's Flight to Schaumburg in the main terminal hangar. The event provides families with a Christmas buffet, holiday music and Santa flying in on a Helicopter. With the event selling out so fast in 2022 the Park District and Airport decided to add an additional time for the event this year. This will allow for two groups of 250 to enjoy Santa's Flight to Schaumburg. Tickets are already sold out for the event.

<u>Rekeying of Airport Hangars and Terminal</u> Airport staff will be working with Action Lock and Key to replace all locks in the terminal building and airport hangars. This will be done to continue the Village's effort to secure the airport. This will allow the Village to update the key list and ensure unapproved duplicates are no longer useable. The rekeying will begin in late November and staff will work with tenants to issue the new keys.

<u>Instrument Approach Feasibility Study</u> The Village of Schaumburg Transportation Department is continuing to pursue an instrument approach at Schaumburg Regional Airport. Flight-Tech is communicating with Chicago TRACON on designs and is working to gain concurrence with them. Flight-Tech has a scheduled meeting in December with Chicago TRACON to further these discussions and will report to staff about their determination.
