What If Drill...Tinker AFB Airshow

This month's "what if drill" is not about an airplane, but about what it would be like if you missed the upcoming Tinker AFB Airshow to be held on 1-2 July 2023.

" WHAT...JF YOU MISSED THE UPCOMING TINKER AFB AIRSHOW TO BE HELD ON 1-2 JULY 2023?"



This year's airshow theme is "STEM Takes Flight" and is dedicated to showing how science, technology, (includes our artisans) engineering, and mathematics help to make the Air Logistics Complex at Tinker AFB successful. There will be a complete hangar dedicated to STEM activities sponsored by the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission. Local aerospace organizations like Career Tech, OU Flight Academy, OSU Engineering, Boeing, Northrup Grumman, Pratt and Whitney, Mid Del Tech, and Rose State will have STEM-related displays. Tinker will have a display focused on how artisans maintain the USAF fleet of bombers, tankers, and engines. In addition to the STEM hangar, there will be aircraft on static display like the new KC-46 aerial refueling tanker, the venerable KC-135 Stratotanker, the legendary B-52, and the E-3 Sentry. The EAA Tri Chapters will be represented with an equally impressive static display of homebuilt aircraft led by Gary and Karen Manning of Chapter 1098.

What you really want to know is who are the flying acts. This year the show will host the Navy Blue Angels, F-35 demonstration team, US Air



Force Academy parachute team, Matt Younkin's Beech 18, Kent Peitsch and the Jelly Belly Interstate Cadet, Adam Baker Extra 300, Tora Tora Tora WWII reenactment, Greg Colyer T-33, P-51 Red Tail act, F-5 and F-35 heritage flight, and Gary Manning's Ercoupe aerobatic routine.

The gates open to the public at 0800, so come early as parking will be at a premium. Aerial performances start at
