The movie included some of the great work done by folks like Lt Gen Thomas P. Stafford (who has an amazing museum at Weatherford, OK). He was an astronaut on Gemini, Apollo and flew the Shuttle and then went on to support development of the F117 and B2. The movie certainly puts Oklahoma in a great light and promotes aviation companies coming to the state. It also compliments EAA's work with Young Eagles and Eagles flight programs to promote folks getting involved in aviation."

Chapter 1612 is currently working with a local t-shirt vendor on the design of our new chapter shirts and hats displaying our chapter logo. We should have some of the new items to show everyone at the January 2023 meeting. It has been a long time coming, but we're almost there.

## Heraldry of the Chapter Logo

If you look closely at the logo on page 1 and below you will notice a few changes to our insignia. There is heraldry behind the chapter logo we should all be aware of as it is our history.

"THERE IS
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First, the logo was designed to reflect our wonderful state which is in the background and is shown in a tan color to exhibit the red dirt so well known as part of the Oklahoma landscape. The light blue background represents the blue within EAA logo and the clear blue sky of Oklahoma which makes flying here so great. Next, the aircraft were chosen to showcase the types of aircraft we build and fly in the chapter. At the top is a Dyke Delta which signifies our roots in design and scratch building. Further, we have a Dyke builder in our chapter—Kelly Troyer. At the bottom is the RV series of kit aircraft many of our chapter members build and fly. To the left is the Champ which represents light sport, antique, and the general aviation aircraft flown by our members. Finally, to the right is an ultralight which reflects the chapter's past history which began as an EAA

Ultralight chapter. The outer ring has stars that signify four of the EAA aviation interest areas—Ultralights, Light Sport, Vintage, and Aerobatics. What of Warbirds? That is the reason for the large 4-blade propellor in the center of the logo.

Finally, the use of Central Oklahoma Sport Flyers signifies the type of flying our members generally do and represents where we are located without tying us to a specific location.

Many chapters have lost the heraldry of their logo/patch; however, Chapter 1612 lead-

ership did not want this to happen. We will ensure the EAA Historian has information and wanted you to be aware as well.

We should all be proud of our past and look forward to a bright future for Chapter 162. Thank you for all that you do for the chapter and, more so, for all that you WILL do to keep our chapter great. See you at the Christmas party. Until then...

# VMC Question of the Month The question:

It is Christmas eve and you are on left downwind to runway 17 at the El Reno airport (El Reno OK) when you see Santa and his sleigh off to your right and slightly higher, planning to land on the same runway. Who has the right of way in the traffic pattern and why?



### What is it?



It is the Stits SA-8A Skeeto. The Skeeto is an early homebuilt ultralight designed by Ray Stits and initially intended to be an affordable light aircraft that could be built complete for under \$500 in 1957. The fuselage was welded steel tubing, with mostly fabric-covered wood construction for the wings and control surfaces. The engine for this

kit venture was to be an off-the-shelf, low-cost model. Test flights were limited to the length of the runway after the aircraft was registered as a "research and development" project. The roll rate was so low at 20-30 mph, that rudder turns were preferred. The 3— to 4-pound wing loading was considered impractical for flying. An example of a SA-8 Skeeto was donated to the Claremont, California Air Museum in 1958; it is now in the EAA AirVenture Museum in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

- The chapter flew three Young Eagles before the meeting start
- VMC question on Aeronautical Chart airport nomenclature, lighting information and airport of entry customs processing were discussed. Very informative and interesting discussion
- "What is it" aircraft the Ray Stits "Skeeto" was discussed by VP D'Angelo
- President Muehlberg queried the membership about the movie "Inside the Sky" which was shown at Gary and Karen Manning's hangar on October 15,2022. Most members thought the movie was good; however, it did have a focus on bringing aerospace companies to Oklahoma. VP D'Angelo, mentioned the movie can be edited to highlight education, aviation history, and military aviation in the area
- President Muehlberg addressed purchasing Chapter merchandise for sale to membership. He also addressed the changes being made to the Chapter logo/patch and stated that there would be more information on the changes in the next newsletter
- Final discussion topic was on how to use the Graham Lee, aluminum tube and gusset construction technique. This construction process use pop rivets in place of welding to build a fuselage. It is employed in the Graham Lee and by Aerodrome Aircraft in Holden MO. President Muehlberg brought an example of the construction process and gave a very informative presentation on how this technique could be used in the design of a light sport aircraft.
