AirVenture dates 2023: July 24 – 30

Public Benefit Aviation to Be Highlighted during AirVenture Oshkosh 2023

PSST! YEAH, YOU. COME over here. Heard you were planning on going to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh this year. Want in on the secrets? Oh, you talked to a friend who was there years ago and now you think you're all set? Know it all, huh? Well listen up, rookie, we're going to help you out. Pull up a chair and we'll do some hangar flying — AirVenture style!

A group of us lucky ones who work at EAA year-round got together in a secret location (actually, it was that odd little conference room in the basement, the one with no door) and came up with some tips. We did the math — we've got 157 years of combined AirVenture experience, so you just might learn a thing or two. We've filled this story with sidebars and stuff so be sure to check those out, too.

A LITTLE HISTORY

It hasn't always been AirVenture. And it hasn't always been in Oshkosh. And it sure as heck hasn't always been this big.

The first fly-in was 70 years ago, back in September 1953, the year Paul and Audrey Poberezny founded EAA. It was at Curtiss-Wright Airport in Milwaukee. Twenty-one aircraft and 150 people showed up. We tried Oshkosh a few years later in 1956, and then moved it back to Milwaukee.

In 1959 it got too big, so we moved it to Rockford, Illinois, for 10 years and then made Oshkosh its permanent home in 1970. It was renamed EAA AirVenture Oshkosh in 1998.

Now it has grown from 21 aircraft to more than 10,000, from 150 people to more than 600.000.

THE OSHKOSH RULES

- Always Treat everyone with kindness.
- Be respectful around all aircraft.
- Pick up trash if you see any.
- Thank the volunteers.

IT'S NOT LIKE OTHER THINGS

Some people call AirVenture "aviation's family reunion" — and that's a darn good description. When you wander around, you're surrounded by friendly and respectful people who love aviation just as much as you do. They're all excited to be here. The result is that Oshkosh becomes the real "Happiest Place on Earth," no matter what you might hear from a certain mouse.

Everyone is either an old friend or a potential new one, and that atmosphere is fun and contagious. As Paul often said, you come for the airplanes but come back for the people. And remember, about 6,000 of those people are the volunteers who work like crazy, sometimes for months, to make sure you enjoy yourself. Plus, thanks to the traditional "Oshkosh Rules" (see sidebar), you won't believe how clean it is.

EAA to Introduce 70th Anniversary Beer at AirVenture 2023

AirVenture attendees and residents of the Fox Valley can get a taste of EAA's 70th anniversary as the organization partners with Stone Arch Brew Pub of Appleton, Wisconsin, to produce a special commemorative beer.

The Kölsch beer will be available in select Fox Valley grocery stores beginning July 1, and sold at camp stores on the grounds during AirVenture 2023, July 24-30. The beer cans will feature one of seven unique labels, one released each day of AirVenture and each representing a part of EAA's history. Only one design will be available in grocery stores, but all seven can be purchased on the AirVenture grounds.

"In 2019, EAA offered a specialty beer to commemorate 50 years in Oshkosh, and it was an instant hit with our members and attendees," said Chris Farrell, EAA's director of events, and food & beverage. "They asked if we could repeat this for EAA's 70th anniversary. It gives us the opportunity to highlight EAA's legacy."

The specific beer was chosen in part by attendees of the Flight at the Museum event in March, and an EAA staff tasting.

Kölsch beer classifies as a "Pale Bitter European Beer," and originates from Germany. This specific Kölsch beer is described as having a "very clean, slightly grainy malt, low bitterness, light hop flavor."

Expanded Youth Activities at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023

A new Youth Welcome Center that serves as the guidepost for all activities aimed at young people is the latest addition to the expanding list of youth activities at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023. The 70th edition of the Experimental Aircraft Association's fly-in convention is July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh.

"Nearly all of us involved in aviation today were inspired at some point in our younger years," said Paul Maloy, EAA's director of education. "When we began welcoming those 18-and-under at no charge beginning in 2021, we immediately noticed an increase in the number of families at AirVenture. With that, we wanted to create a way to help them find all the available activities on grounds suitable for various age groups."

The Youth Welcome Center, located at the busy Four Corners intersection just west of Boeing Plaza, will be the headquarters for sharing youth-oriented activities for all ages on the grounds, as well as important information for families ranging from restrooms and shade to ATMs and changing/nursing stations. In addition, several activities at the Center include an F-100 Super Sabre cockpit photo op, an RC airplane spotter activity, and a place to mark a visitor's hometown. The Center will also have information on EAA's many year-round youth education programs.

Other family-friendly locations on the AirVenture grounds include:

<u>KidVenture</u> - Located at the EAA Aviation Museum's Pioneer Airport, this area allows young people to explore aviation from several different fronts. Learn how to fly a radio-controlled airplane, experience flight simulators, and learn aviation history. Highlights include A&P booths where kids learn basic building skills, a simulated B-25 flight experience, and life-size replicas of the Mercury 7 and Gemini 7 space capsules.

AeroEducate Center - Located at the south entrance to Aviation Gateway Park just northwest of the FAA Control Tower, the AeroEducate Center features activities for middle- and high-school youth. Along with EAA AeroEducate hands-on projects, there are NASA-supported activities, challenges from AeroEducate partners Airbus, United Airlines, and Siemens Technology, plus presentations on opportunities available in aviation and aerospace.

Flight Simulators - Flight simulators and other activities are available in both the **Warbirds of America** and **Vintage Aircraft Association** areas on the grounds.

In addition, numerous AirVenture exhibitors feature unique youth-focused displays and activities for young people at their locations. Free youth admission is sponsored by The Boeing Company.

EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Notice Includes Important Procedure Updates

There are several important FAA-approved changes in the EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Notice (commonly referred to as the Oshkosh NOTAM), featuring arrival and departure procedures for EAA's 70th fly-in convention on July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh. These changes are based on pilot feedback and FAA review of arrival procedure recommendations.

The document is in effect from noon CDT on Thursday, July 20, until noon CDT on Monday, July 31, and outlines procedures for the many types of aircraft that fly to Oshkosh for the event, as well as aircraft that land at nearby airports. The Notice was designed by the FAA to assist pilots in their EAA AirVenture flight planning. It is now known as the Oshkosh Notice instead of a NOTAM because of a changed FAA internal procedure.

Some of the 2023 changes include:

- A change in the AirVenture ultralight pattern at Wittman Regional Airport.
- Guidance regarding Oshkosh aircraft parking areas, including North 40/South 40 designation.
- Elimination of the Fond du Lac diversion procedure.
- The start time of the daily air shows has been changed from 2:30 to 2:15 p.m. CDT.
- The Notice and its procedures are effective through noon CDT on Monday, July 31.

The ATC-assignable transition points approaching Oshkosh from the west that will ease holding and congestion will again be in effect in 2023. These points are at Endeavor Bridge, Puckaway Lake, and Green Lake. They will be announced on the arrival ATIS when ATC activates them at times of highest traffic flows.

"The most essential information for any pilot flying to Oshkosh involves reading and thoroughly understanding the 2023 AirVenture Notice to ensure safe operations on arrival and departure," said Sean Elliott, EAA's vice president of advocacy and safety. "This FAA Notice document states the official requirements and expectations for pilots. We also urge all pilots to log appropriate cross-country time prior to their trip to Oshkosh so they have the proficiency and confidence to fly safely." EAA is also hosting a webinar on June 14 at 7 p.m. regarding flying to AirVenture 2023 and changes in this year's Notice. Pilots are encouraged to participate to build their knowledge prior to their flights to Oshkosh.





EAA284 History

Experimental Aircraft Association Chapter 284 was chartered at Highland County Airport, Hillsboro, Ohio in 1967. Sadly, after a few years it became inactive and dissolved as a chapter. In 1991 several employees of the air cargo carrier Airborne Express (who were EAA members) met at Doug Wright's home to discuss forming a new EAA chapter at Wilmington, Ohio. Further investigation through EAA National at Oshkosh revealed that it might be easier to reactivate EAA 284 and the decision was promptly made to do just that. Subsequent paperwork was filed and EAA 284 was reactivated in late 1991 with Doug Wright as its President. Finding a permanent home was a bit more trying. In the following months, the Chapter met at a Methodist Church in Wilmington and back at the original home of Highland County Airport. Still, no place offered just the right formula of atmosphere and growth potential. The search for a suitable home continued. Many of the charter members regularly flew out of a 2500 ft sod airport situated between Dayton and Cincinnati, operated by the Stewart family since 1946. Red Stewart Field (401) specialized in taildragger instruction and rental, flying in classics such as the Cub, Champ, and Taylorcraft. It was just the kind of strip that reeked old time flying and grassroots aviation. Cub and Cathy Stewart graciously agreed to provide the reactivated EAA 284 a new home worthy of any EAA chapter.

In 1992 we hosted our first event – The EAA 284 Taildragger Fly-In. It has since become a regional favorite of all pilots. We have also restored an Aeronca Champ as part of the rental fleet at Stewart Field. We are proud to be part of a grassroots, barnstorming tradition here at Red Stewart Field and gladly welcome all to stop by and visit us.

As a local chapter of the EAA we try to do our part to further the cause of sport aviation and support the folks who support us. In the process we have a lot of fun, and that is what it is all about. Come on out and have a seat on the "Liars Bench" with us, share a soda and a few tall tales. We will listen and do not be surprised if we laugh. We like to say that we are: *Dedicated to the spirit of aviation past, devoted to the future.*


