Have Thoughts on MOSAIC? Share Them With Us!

The NPRM continues EAA efforts to keep aviation safe, affordable, and accessible by expanding the already successful rules of light-sport aircraft and sport pilots.

The FAA's release of the MOSAIC NPRM just before AirVenture led to a significant amount of positive energy throughout Convention week. The NPRM continues EAA efforts to keep aviation safe, affordable, and accessible by expanding the already successful rules of light-sport aircraft and sport pilots.

During AirVenture, EAA's advocacy staff participated in numerous meetings, forums, and other lively discussions with members, vendors, and other associations discussing the details and impacts of the proposed rule. MOSAIC Takes Significant Step Forward | EAA

EAA continues to evaluate the proposal, and in doing so, would like to hear your thoughts. To do so, we have established mosaic@eaa.org and encourage you to send us your comments and suggestions on the proposed rule. Important to remember, comments and suggestions supported by well-thought-out safety justifications have the most impact and best chance of influencing changes to proposed rules. Well before the October 23, 2023, closing of the NPRM comment period, EAA will provide further in-depth analysis along with suggested guidance on key themes to help members draft comments in response to the NPRM.

EAA Files Comments to Destroyed and Scrapped Aircraft Policy

This week, EAA filed comments to a new FAA advisory circular (AC) entitled "Destroyed and Scrapped Aircraft." The AC makes heavy reference to FAA Order 8900.19, which shares the same name and was issued without the opportunity for public comment in 2018.

The order and AC discuss how an aircraft is determined to be destroyed and scrapped. Aircraft declared as such cannot be rebuilt, per 14 CFR 45.13 and 47.41. Order 8900.19 defines a "destroyed" aircraft as one having no repairable "primary structures" and a "scrapped" aircraft as one that "has been discarded and disposed of in a manner that it cannot be repaired to an airworthy condition." On its face, this is a reasonable interpretation of the rule that would allow all but the most severely damaged aircraft to return to service with the proper repairs.

As with any FAA policy, EAA aims to ensure consistent, reasonable application in the field. While we are not aware of significant problems in the use of this policy in the past five years, EAA's comments to the AC urge the greatest flexibility possible, including the expanded use of designees in determining a damaged or disposed aircraft's status and developing a plan for return to service.

We feel that more designee options would ease the workload on FAA field offices while bringing decision makers with ample practical experience into the fold. As EAA's comments note, "This change would not remove the FSDO or [Aircraft Certification Branch] from being eligible to review repair data; rather, it would provide an additional option to the builder/repairer to utilize, if desired."

Airport friends,



Airport Identifier Changing to GDK Soon

This is an early notification that the Greene County - Lewis A Jackson Regional Airport identifier will be changing from **I19 to GDK** effective with the FAA November publication cycle (likely November 2, 2023).

Why?

- This will eliminate the confusion and flight planning errors with the airport in Indiana (119 Delphi Municipal).
- Airports that have runways longer than 5,000' and AWOS-3 weather reporting typically have all-letter identifiers - ours qualifies after the runway extension to 5,004'.
- When the 'K" prefix is used ie KI19, it can cause search failures in certain flight management databases.

Why GDK and not GCA, GRE, etc?

 Identifiers are assigned by region by the FAA. While GRE or similar would be preferred, only 2 IDs were available in our geographic area and the Airport Authority chose GDK.

Please make sure your charts, databases, etc are updated regularly. Thank you and let me know if you have any questions.



WAI2024 Scholarships Online

Start applying for available scholarships!

August 14, 2023 – Utilizing a new online platform, the 2024 Women in Aviation International (WAI) scholarship program is officially open, and members can review dozens of scholarships at www.WAI.org/scholarships. Currently, there are over 105 scholarships valued at more than \$1,000,000 offered for flight training, engineering, maintenance, dispatch, drones, and professional development for individuals in all stages of life. This 2024 scholarship cycle includes nearly 10 new scholarships to further members' learning in flight training, space engineering, and aircraft maintenance. Applicants are encouraged to check for new scholarships often and may apply for up to three scholarships per year.

"WAI proactively works to address our industry's challenges, and one of those priorities is investing in our current and future global workforce," says WAI Interim CEO Stephanie Kenyon. "The support of our annual scholarship program is one of the major benefits of being a WAI member, and we appreciate the generosity of our scholarship sponsors." The total amount of scholarships awarded by WAI since 1995 is now more than \$16.4 million.

Many of the 2024 scholarships will be awarded during the 35th Annual Women in Aviation International Conference in Orlando, Florida, from March 21-23, 2024. In order to qualify for a scholarship, the applicant must be a WAI member as of October 1, 2023. Applications must be submitted to WAI by 11:59 p.m. EDT October 12, 2023.
