EAA Takes Part in FAA UAS Symposium

July 9, 2020 – EAA took part in the FAA's UAS Symposium, a virtual event focused on the integration of unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) into the National Airspace System (NAS). This week saw the first of two two-day episodes, and it featured speakers and panels including high-level FAA officials all the way up to the administrator, as well as various industry experts.

The topic of this first part of the UAS Symposium was unmanned traffic management (UTM) and international UAS integration. EAA continues to hold firmly the position that as integration moves forward and UTM systems are developed, traditional model aircraft must be allowed to continue to operate safely in the airspace as they have for decades. Additionally, the burden of sensing and avoiding traffic must fall to unmanned operators, and no new equipment requirements will be acceptable for manned aircraft.

Seeking Turf Operations at KOSH

July 30, 2020 – EAA and Wittman Regional Airport representatives met with FAA airport officials this week to discuss the establishment of turf operations at Wittman, something long desired by vintage/tailwheel aircraft owners at many airports across the country. This meeting took the form of a safety risk management panel, or SRM.

Because FAA Air Traffic Organization convened an SRM to consider the proposal, EAA felt this was a good opportunity to set a benchmark through the data driven SRM process that other towered operations could benefit from. During the course of the SRM, the key stakeholders reviewed more than 40 areas in question. In reviewing each of the 40 items, the agency determined there was "no hazard finding" for everything listed by the proposal. This effectively should clear the way from an air traffic perspective to begin turf operations at the desired location on the airport throughout the year. "EAA came well prepared to this session, and participated as a subject matter expert, offering solutions to mitigate risk. Currently across the country, turf operations are less common at towered airports. EAA members and many airport tenants want to change that," said Sean Elliott, EAA's vice president of advocacy and safety. "While this turf operation would not be available during the AirVenture NOTAM period, it offers a blueprint on how an airport can accommodate the needs of those who fly tailwheel and other aircraft that benefit, safety-wise, from landing on turf when available."

Elliott added that the steps and risk mitigation undertaken at Oshkosh could be the basis for future FAA policy for airport tenants and users who are seeking similar opportunities for turf operations as an alternate landing area. While turf and paved runways can both be found at small airports throughout the country, added complexities at towered airports have previously made turf operations not as common.

EAA will continue to work with the FAA and local airport officials on the opportunities that might be available for turf operations.



We are living in an ever changing world. And we will be doing some things differently at our Young Eagle Rallies. Below is our initial plan which is subject to change and we are still working on some of the details. Any volunteer who will be in direct contact with our guests will need to wear a facemask. We will have hand sanitizer available for use. We will need ad-ditional people to help with the logistics of all the extra safety precautions.

Registration – parents should be strongly encouraged to register their kids on their smart phone. If parents use our computers to register, we will clean the keyboard after each use. This includes being used by an EAA volunteer. Registration volunteers will stand on the opposite side of the table from where the parents and kids are.

Ground instruction – family groups can stay together as a group but each group will need to be separated by six feet. The ground instructor will speak from the opposite side of the table from where the family groups are standing. Seating – chairs will be set up in groups so family groups can sit together as a group but each group will need to be separated by six feet. These may need to be rearranged as need-ed throughout the event. Chairs will need to be cleaned after each use.

Flying – we will ask each parent if it is OK for their kids to fly with another family's kids. Pilots will wear a facemask and needs to have his own pen. Kids will wear a facemask when flying and use hand sanitizer before the flight. Each pilot should clean the hard surfaces of the plane that the kids may have touched after each flight


