Chapter Leaders, Beware of Scams

December 2022 – Spammers have gotten much more sophisticated in recent years and their grammar and punctuation have improved! Don't let a carefully crafted scam separate your chapter from its hard-earned money.

Here at EAA, our chapters share examples of scams with us — including scams where actual chapter officer names are inserted into phony email invoices addressed to the chapter treasurers or other officers. The goal of the scam is to trick the chapter into paying fake invoices.

Keep in mind that scammers only have to be successful once in a while to make sending those emails worth it. Recent scam styles include phony paper applications (forms) mailed to chapters from apparent state-based corporate processing services for chapters to join. The forms look alarmingly like traditional IRS-style forms. There are always new tactics being tested, so don't be fooled. Never pay an invoice without chapter officer discussion and approval, and keep in mind that "urgent" requests for chapters are exceedingly rare and should always be viewed with skepticism.

General Aviation Moves Closer to an Unleaded Future

The FAA today signed supplemental type certificates to allow General Aviation Modifications Inc.'s 100-octane unleaded fuel (G100UL) to be used in every general spark-ignition engine and every airframe powered by those engines. The move was hailed by the GA industry as a major step in the transition to an unleaded future. The FAA's approval of the use of G100UL fuel in all piston aircraft directly addresses the industry's long-standing goal of finding unleaded solutions that can be used for the entire GA piston fleet.

"Congratulations to GAMI on this achievement, which is another initial step toward a goal we all want – an unleaded fuel for general aviation," said Jack J. Pelton, EAA CEO and Chairman of the Board. "This is a significant accomplishment that opens the door to the hard work that remains to create a commercial pathway and acceptance across the broad spectrum of GA aircraft."

In 2021 the FAA approved STCs for GAMI covering a smaller number of Cessna 172 engines and airframes, and then expanded those STC approved model list (AML) to include essentially all lower-compression engines. Though that was seen as an encouraging step forward in the yearslong path to supply unleaded aviation fuel to the piston aircraft fleet, the STC's did not include aircraft needing the higher-octane fuel that accounts for approximately two-thirds of avgas consumption. Today's announcement by the FAA addresses the needs of those higher-compression engines.

GAMI co-founder George Braly said, "This is a big day for the industry. It means that for a lot of our general aviation communities, and especially for a high fraction on the West Coast, relief is on the way. And it means that our industry will be able to go into the future and prosper, and provide the essential infrastructure for this country for everything from Angel Flights to critical training of our future airline pilots."

Braly thanked the GA community for its support through this long process. "Without it we couldn't have gotten this done," he said.

GAMI's Braly has said that Ann Arbor, Michigan-based fuel supplier AvFuel is standing by to manage the logistics and distribution of G100UL, and said he is open to partnerships. "Our arrangement is that any qualified refiner or blender of existing aviation fuels will be eligible to produce and sell it subject to the quality assurance requirements that the FAA has approved," he said.

The timing for when G100UL will reach airports is still uncertain. "It's going to take a while to manage the infrastructure including manufacturing and distribution," Braly said. The supply chain "is still a very wounded infrastructure and that's not going to make the process any easier, but we have a handle on how to do this, and with the support of the major players I think we can do that. It's going to be limited to begin with, but it can be ramped up rapidly," he said.

Pelton noted that certain regions, such as the West Coast, are priorities to receive approval as soon as practical. Some California municipalities, for instance, prematurely banned the sale of leaded avgas and threatened a safe and smart transition to unleaded.

"There is a process in place for a safe transition to unleaded fuel for the GA fleet," Pelton said. "Let's keep forging ahead on that path in a unified fashion, rather than a patchwork of local ordinances that will only set political hurdles in front of the ultimate goal."

While the cost of the fuel has not been determined, Braly said the small batch production process that will initially mark the arrival of G100UL at airports means that the fuel will cost slightly more than leaded avgas. "Small volume batches cost money," he said. "Until we can get [production] revved up that we're making millions of gallons at a time, there will be an incremental cost," he said.

"It's not going to be unreasonable," Braly added. "Pilots in America will not be paying what they're paying for avgas in Europe today."

Owners can also expect to see engines that operate more efficiently. "I think the days of cleaning spark plugs every 50 hours are going to be behind us for good," Braly said.

Swift Fuels Inc., an Indiana based company, has received FAA approval for its 94-octane unleaded fuel, and has expanded its distribution, particularly to the West Coast. Swift Fuels' 94-octane fuel meets some, but not all, of the demand of aircraft with lower-compression engines. The company is developing a 100R unleaded fuel with more than 10 percent renewable content.

In addition, two fuel candidates are currently in the EAGLE/PAFI testing process. All fuel manufacturers continue to be encouraged to follow through with their own formulations, Pelton said. "Innovation and multiple options have always been a key to ultimate success, so we welcome any and all ideas to bring unleaded fuel to the marketplace for general aviation."

F-22 Demo Team schedule includes Oshkosh

The <u>U.S. Air Force's F-22 Demo team</u> announced its 2023 schedule at this week's International Council of Air Shows (ICAS) convention in Las Vegas, and EAA AirVenture Oshkosh is among the appearance locations listed. According to the schedule, the F-22 team is scheduled to be in Oshkosh on July 27-30, the final four days of AirVenture 2023.

Along with the solo F-22 demos, the team participates in the U.S. Air Force Heritage Flight program. This program is extremely popular with Oshkosh air show crowds, as it matches current military fighter jets with vintage warbirds from World War II and other eras.

The F-22 team is stationed with the 1st Fighter Wing at Joint Base Langley-Eustis in Hampton, Virginia. In March 2007, the team participated in its debut air show at Tyndall Air Force Base. Since then, the team has performed more than 250 demonstrations across the world.

EAA Young Eagles Program Sees a Return to Normalcy in 2022

After two years of decreased participation due to the COVID-19 pandemic, 2022 has seen EAA's Young Eagles program rebound and reach tens of thousands of young people through participation in aviation.

More than 49,000 youths ages 8 to 17 experienced The Spirit of Aviation this year through a free introductory flight in an aircraft. These flights were all made possible by 4,078 pilots who volunteered their time to help, with 1,159 of those pilots new to the Young Eagles program in 2022.

"We are thrilled to see an increase in the number of pilots looking to help inspire the next generation of aviators," said David Leiting, EAA Eagles program manager. "For pilots, the rewards of flying Young Eagles are immeasurable. The only way we get more young people involved in aviation is to have more pilots participate, so the open invitation is always there."

Since August 1, 2022, 93 pilots completed the 30 for 30 challenge to fly 30 youths to celebrate the program's 30th anniversary. Pilots who reach this milestone will be awarded a commemorative polo shirt. The challenge runs through July 31, 2023. Pilots interested in flying Young Eagles can learn more about the program at EAA.org/YoungEagles.

The Young Eagles program is quickly approaching a total of 2.3 million free introductory flights since its launch in 1992 and continues to be the largest aviation education program ever created.

The Young Eagles program is presented by Phillips 66 with additional support from Sporty's, United Airlines, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Garmin, Lightspeed, Academy of Model Aeronautics, and Global Aerospace.

Homebuilders Week – Online Event Starts January 23

It will be five straight days of educational forums covering a broad spectrum of aircraft building topics. It will start on Monday, January 23, 2023, and run until Friday, January 27, 2023. The live online presentations will be open to everyone interested in building their own aircraft. Sessions will start at 11:30 a.m. CST and run until 8:30 p.m. CST daily.

This event is an opportunity for a new person to jump in with both feet and learn a lot about the wonderful world of homebuilding. We will cover areas like getting started successfully and techniques when building with sheet metal, composites, steel, and wood. Apply for AOPA scholarships

More than \$1 million in scholarships available

The financial constraints of an aviation education shouldn't prevent prospective student pilots or aviation enthusiasts from pursuing their dreams. Through the generosity of member donations, the foundation aims to relieve the financial burden of education and training—offering dozens of scholarship packages annually ranging from \$2,500 to \$14,000.

One notable example is the high volume of scholarships offered for flight training courtesy of the Ray Foundation, founded by and named for aviator, philanthropist, and entrepreneur James C. Ray. These scholarships each include a \$10,000 award for the purpose of obtaining a private pilot certificate. Eighty scholarships are allocated for high school students and up to 20 for high school educators who use the AOPA Foundation You Can Fly High School Aviation STEM Curriculum.

Other fantastic scholarships to keep on your radar include the Landsberg Endowment Scholarship – Aviation Maintenance and Avionics for those interested in pursuing an aviation maintenance technician certificate, and the Edward B. Shafer Future of Flight Scholarship for those interested in pursuing a career in aviation (including aerospace engineering, professional pilot, aircraft maintenance, airport management, or another avenue).

The 2023 scholarship window opened September 5, and applications will be accepted through February 10 at 11:59 p.m. Eastern time. This year AOPA has made it easier than ever to apply, moving to one streamlined application. All applicants must be a member of AOPA, and student pilots, youth, and military personnel are eligible for a free AOPA membership. Our goal is to get the EAA Ford Tri-Motor back on tour by June of 2023!

EAA's Ford Tri-Motor, otherwise known as the "Tin Goose", is one of a few remaining today. As one of America's first mass-produced airliners, it brings to mind an era of excitement and energy.

The center section of the wing on the Tri-Motor is currently being replaced. The airplane sits in the hangar with the engines, props, landing gear, and outer wings all removed to gain access to the center section.

The center section was removed and is at Hov-Aire, Inc. in Three Rivers, MI. Hov-Aire is transferring brackets, pulleys, and mounts before returning it to Oshkosh for installation. While this takes place, the EAA team is repairing and repainting engine mounts for reinstallation.

EAA's goal is to have the first flight after reassembly by March 31, 2023. The goal is to work on discrepancies, train, and get the EAA Ford Tri-Motor out on tour by June of next year.

Donations to the EAA Aviation Foundation help make developments like this to our aircraft. We want everyone to enjoy our touring aircraft for decades to come. Thank you for your support!
