AirVenture dates 2023: July 24 – 30

AirVenture Commemorates 30 Years of Women Flying Combat Aircraft During EAA Women Venture on July 26

Celebrating women advancing in aviation, including 30 years of flying active-duty combat aircraft, will be part of EAA Women Venture on July 26 during EAA AirVenture Oshkosh. The 70th edition of EAA's fly-in convention is July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

<u>EAA Women Venture</u> has become an annual gathering point for women involved in aviation, from the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) of World War II to teenagers involved in <u>EAA's Girl Venture</u> day camp that week. The programs are designed to encourage and inspire women who want to pursue their dreams of flight.

"What we've seen over the 15-plus years of EAA Women Venture is that it has become an unforgettable annual reunion of all women engaged in aviation," said Margaret Viola, an EAA-member pilot who is the volunteer chair of the event. "We are inspired by those who came before us and, in turn, are enthused to share the world of flight with others who want to become part of it. It's a celebration that happens in a unique way at Oshkosh."

Events will be held all week, with an emphasis on July 26 activities, including commemoration of 30 years of women flying combat missions in the U.S. military. Programs during the week include:

- **All week:** EAA Women Venture Center, located at Aviation Gateway Park, features exhibitors and events that support women in aviation.
- Monday, July 24: Ice Cream Social, sponsored by Endeavor Air (SOLD OUT)
- Wednesday, July 26:

- Power Lunch, Theater in the Woods (SOLD OUT), with keynote speaker Michelle "Mace" Curran, author, and former U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds pilot, presenting Upside Down Dreams.
- Evening program, Theater in the Woods, 6:30 p.m., with pioneering women military pilots Jeannie Leavitt, Sharon Preszler, and Martha McSally, plus more women pilots who have served in the U.S. armed forces.
- Thursday, July 27: Female aviation authors featured all day at EAA Women Venture Center.
- July 26-29: Evening activities hosted by exhibitors on Women Venture Center patio.

AirVenture 2023 Warbirds Pre-Registration Open



If you are planning to fly your warbird to EAA AirVenture

Oshkosh 2023, the pre-registration process has begun. Here are the details:

- 1. You must have an EAA Warbirds of America membership that is current through 07/31/2023 or beyond.
- 2. If you need to join EAA Warbirds of America for the first time, visit: <u>Join EAA and Warbirds</u>.
- 3. If you need to renew you membership visit: Renew your Membership.

Take care of your membership before you pre-register. If you are not current, you will not have access to the Warbirds pre-registration system.

Air Show

If you plan to fly in any of the daily EAA Warbirds of America air shows, you must submit all pilot air show documentation electronically, including your medical certificate, pilot certificate (both sides), FAST card (if flying formation), and aircraft insurance. Have electronic versions ready to upload during pre-registration.

Static Display and Parking in Warbirds

If you plan to park your airplane in the Warbirds area during AirVenture Oshkosh 2023, please be sure to fill out the pre-registration via the link below. You will not need any pilot documents to park in Warbirds. You will need to pre-register.

Pre-Registration

Pre-registration is open now until the day before you expect to arrive at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023.

If you need to pre-register more than one aircraft, you will have the ability to enter multiple aircraft during the same session by clicking on "Add Another Aircraft" after entering the first aircraft. To pre-register your warbird aircraft, follow this link: Register my aircraft.

EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Notice Includes Important Procedure Updates

There are several important FAA-approved changes in the EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Notice (commonly referred to as the Oshkosh NOTAM), featuring arrival and departure procedures for EAA's 70th fly-in convention on July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh. These changes are based on pilot feedback and FAA review of arrival procedure recommendations. The document is in effect from noon CDT on Thursday, July 20, until noon CDT on Monday, July 31, and outlines procedures for the many types of aircraft that fly to Oshkosh for the event, as well as aircraft that land at nearby airports. The Notice was designed by the FAA to assist pilots in their EAA AirVenture flight planning. It is now known as the Oshkosh Notice instead of a NOTAM because of a changed FAA internal procedure.

Some of the 2023 changes include:

- A change in the AirVenture ultralight pattern at Wittman Regional Airport.
- Guidance regarding Oshkosh aircraft parking areas, including North 40/South 40 designation.
- Elimination of the Fond du Lac diversion procedure.
- The start time of the daily air shows has been changed from 2:30 to 2:15 p.m. CDT.
- The Notice and its procedures are effective through noon CDT on Monday, July 31.

The ATC-assignable transition points approaching Oshkosh from the west that will ease holding and congestion will again be in effect in 2023. These points are at Endeavor Bridge, Puckaway Lake, and Green Lake. They will be announced on the arrival ATIS when ATC activates them at times of highest traffic flows.

"The most essential information for any pilot flying to Oshkosh involves reading and thoroughly understanding the 2023 AirVenture Notice to ensure safe operations on arrival and departure," said Sean Elliott, EAA's vice president of advocacy and safety. "This FAA Notice document states the official requirements and expectations for pilots. We also urge all pilots to log appropriate cross-country time prior to their trip to Oshkosh so they have the proficiency and confidence to fly safely." EAA is also hosting a webinar on June 14 at 7 p.m. regarding flying to AirVenture

<u>2023</u> and changes in this year's Notice. Pilots are encouraged to participate to build their knowledge prior to their flights to Oshkosh.

Devotion Highlights Fly-In Theater Lineup at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023

Last year's biographical film highlighting Medal of Honor recipient Tom Hudner and Jesse Brown leads this year's impressive schedule of aviation movies at the Fly-In Theater during EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023. The Fly-In Theater is part of the daily schedule at the 70th EAA fly-in convention on July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport.

For more than 15 years, the Fly-In Theater has been a tradition for AirVenture attendees. Located adjacent to EAA's Camp Scholler campground, the Fly-In Theater provides the perfect opportunity to relax after a long day of air shows, exhibits, and workshops. The nightly movies are shown on a five-story high movie screen and introduced by personalities ranging from aviation legends to Hollywood superstars. The Fly-In Theater is presented by Lycoming and supported by Southwest Airlines.

The Fly-In Theater films, which are included with AirVenture daily and weekly admission, are shown nightly from Saturday, July 22, through Saturday, July 29 (weather permitting), beginning at 8:30 p.m. (Devotion programming will begin early at 8:15 p.m.) For many of the films, special guests connected with the film, or the aircraft involved will help introduce the screening. This year's stellar schedule includes:

- Saturday, July 22: *Top Gun* (1986) The all-time favorite film about naval aviation starring Tom Cruise, Anthony Edwards, and Val Kilmer.
- Sunday, July 23: *Top Gun: Maverick* (2022). Tom Cruise, Jennifer Connelly, and Miles Teller update the story of Capt. Pete Mitchell as a legendary test pilot called back to train a new group of hot shots.
- Monday, July 24: *Tail Spin* (1939). Alice Faye, Constance Bennett, and Nancy Kelly star in this drama centered on three female pilots competing in the Cleveland Air Races.
- Tuesday, July 25: The Great Waldo Pepper (1975). A World War I veteran pilot takes up barnstorming and teams up with a fellow war veteran to perform stunts and reenact air battles from the Great War in the early days of Hollywood. Starring Robert Redford and Bo Svenson.
- Wednesday, July 26: *Amelia* (2009). Hilary Swank stars in this biographical film about the life of Amelia Earhart from the beginning of her aviation interest to her disappearance in 1937.
- Thursday, July 27: Flight of the Intruder (1991). Danny Glover, Willem Dafoe, and Brad Johnson star in a Vietnam War thriller about a pilot and navigator who execute an unauthorized strike on Hanoi.
- Friday, July 28: *Devotion* (2022). Glen Powell and Jonathan Majors star in a retelling of the bond between Tom Hudner and Jesse Brown during the Korean War.
- Saturday, July 29: Those Magnificent Men in their Flying Machines (1965). A comedy
 about a British newspaper publisher who organizes an air race from London to Paris to
 promote British aviation. Staring Stuart Whitman, Sarah Miles, and Terry-Thomas.

Historic Homebuilt Aircraft Anniversaries Part of EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Activities

A number of iconic homebuilt aircraft designs will be celebrating notable anniversaries this year at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, which annually brings together the world's largest gathering of amateur-built aircraft. The 70th edition of EAA's fly-in convention is July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

"Homebuilding has been at the core of EAA since the first meeting in Milwaukee in 1953 with homebuilt aircraft continuing to represent a substantial percentage of the 10,000-plus aircraft that fly into AirVenture every year," said Charlie Becker, EAA's homebuilt community manager. "As we celebrate our organization's 70 years, several popular designs are celebrating their own anniversaries, and we invite all owners of those aircraft to come to Oshkosh to help commemorate the occasion."

Anniversary aircraft owners are encouraged to pre-register so they can receive updates on special events, parking, and other activities connected to their airplane type. Among the aircraft designs reaching important anniversaries in 2023 are:

- Midget Mustang 75th anniversary Single-seat aerobatic sport airplane designed by David Long
- Wittman Tailwind 70th anniversary A two-seat, high-wing monoplane designed by legendary designer and racer Steve Wittman
- Thorp T-18 60th anniversary All-metal fully bubble canopied aircraft, well-known for being the first homebuilt aircraft to successfully circumnavigate the world.
- Hiperbipe 50th anniversary A two-seat aerobatic biplane designed by Sorrell Aviation
- Sonex 25th anniversary A kit manufacturer based in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, and founded by EAA Homebuilders Hall of Fame member John Monnett
- Van's RV-10 20th anniversary A four-seat, low-wing plane designed by Dick VanGrunsven, part of the world's most popular series of homebuilt aircraft.



Chapter Blast for Your Events

Now that spring is here in the northern hemisphere and summer is approaching, your chapter likely has a variety of events planned for the year. You might have your annual fly-in coming up, or one of your regular pancake breakfasts, and you want to ensure there is a high turnout to bring in new members and fundraising. Perhaps you have a special guest speaker coming to your chapter, and you want to bring in the local community to see them. Maybe you have a Young Eagles rally that you want to promote to bring more youths into the chapter. Maybe you started a VMC or IMC Club and you want to bring in more pilots to reap its benefits. Or perhaps your chapter is hosting an open house at the local airport that will show off the positive effects the airport brings to the local area.

If you want to bring more people to your events, then a Chapter Blast will help you out. A Chapter Blast is a free promotional email sent by EAA on your chapter's behalf to all EAA members within roughly 75 miles of your event's location. The email contains all the details about your event, including what it is, when and where it takes place, and who to contact for more information. Chapter Blasts are a great complement to other means of getting the word out such as press releases, flyers, brochures, and online calendars of events.

Chapter Blasts are only available to active EAA chapters (including divisional chapters/squadrons) for chapter-organized events. They must be requested by a chapter officer, such as the chapter's president, at least 30 days prior to the date of your event.

Each chapter is limited to three Chapter Blasts per year, so you should carefully consider which events your chapter would like to promote. If you seek to increase your chapter's membership, then a Chapter Blast is an excellent choice for promoting a high-profile public event that will attract new faces. You can show the EAA members in your region that your chapter exists, and by inviting them to your event, you will pique their interest in your chapter and encourage them to join.

To request a Chapter Blast, all you have to do is complete the online form below. The EAA Chapters team will take care of the rest.

Request a Chapter Blast

After your request has been submitted, the EAA Chapters team will craft a draft Chapter Blast based on the information you provided. We will email the draft to the person listed as the chapter's contact for the event. This person should make sure all the information in the draft is correct. Once the chapter's contact approves the draft, then EAA will schedule the Chapter Blast to be sent. The Chapter Blast will be sent around 10 days before the scheduled event. Remember that requesting a Chapter Blast from EAA counts toward one of the points for Chapter Recognition each year. This is one of the easiest ways to boost your chapter's recognition score.
