EAA AirVenture Safety Protocols Last updated April 19, 2021.

- EAA members now have the option to receive admissions credentials including wristbands in advance through our Express Arrival program. This is offered at no extra charge when you purchase your
- Masks will be strongly recommended if you are unable to social distance (roughly 6 feet or 2 meters).
- Proof of COVID vaccine will not be required to attend.
- International visitation is dependent on current international travel regulations and mandates in the U.S. and individual countries of residence.
- Increased physical distancing will be encouraged in all areas.
- EAA is adding significant numbers of sanitizing facilities and working with industry-leading companies for continual disinfection throughout the grounds.
- Theater in the Woods, forums pavilions, and other outdoor venues will operate with reduced seating capacity, with social distancing opportunities on the open grounds at that location.
- There will be fewer exhibitors in each indoor exhibit building, creating more walkways and separation between exhibitors. Additional venues on the grounds are being re-purposed to accommodate indoor exhibitors that are moved this year.
- · Wherever possible, ventilation will be increased in tents and indoor facilities.
- Several annual events where physical distancing is not possible will not be held this year, including the Monday night concert; the Young Eagles, EAA Lifetime Member, and International Visitors dinners; the Runway 5K run/walk; the WomenVenture social; the Seaplane Base's Watermelon social, and large corporate events and receptions.
- High-demand forums and presentations will be scheduled more than once to accommodate demand while allowing for distancing.

IAC Announces National Aerobatics Day

March 11, 2021 – The skill, beauty, and excitement of aerobatic flight will be celebrated on Saturday, June 26, during the inaugural National Aerobatics Day, as announced by Jim Bourke, President of the International Aerobatics Club (IAC).

"National Aerobatics Day is the perfect day to host an aerobatic camp, a BBQ, a practice session, or to share videos of aerobatic activity online," Bourke said. "With over 40 chapters nationwide and two international chapters, IAC members will be organizing these types of activities and others to engage the public and general aviation pilots in aerobatics."

IAC has established National Aerobatics Day as the fourth Saturday in June each year. It will highlight the dedicated pilots who fly these precision maneuvers as well as the ground support teams that make it possible.

Greg Principato, President and CEO of the National Aeronautic Association, enthusiastically stated: "Aerobatics thrill. They also inspire. And there is no telling to what heights that inspiration will take someone!"

Originally developed as evasive maneuvers during World War I, aerobatics is a proven discipline that builds confidence and improves pilot proficiency. The loops, rolls, hammerheads, and lomcevaks are examples of precision flying at its finest, and most fun!

"There are few things in life and nothing else in aviation that are as joyful and liberating as flying aerobatics," said John Cudahy, President of the International Council of Air Shows. "And the idea of devoting one day each year to celebrating aerobatics is brilliant."

The IAC exists to promote the safety and enjoyment of this great sport — what better way to celebrate than to set aside a special day to recognize the aerobatic community, and engage in sharing a passion that too few get to experience?

AME guidance released for pilots who have had COVID-19 By Alyssa J. Cobb

The FAA on March 26 released much-anticipated guidance to aviation medical examiners about how to handle medical certificate applications from pilots and air traffic control specialists who have had confirmed cases of COVID-19.

As long as the pilot or ATC specialist is otherwise qualified, an AME can issue a medical certificate when the person who had a confirmed case of COVID-19 has fully recovered and was asymptomatic or had a mild infection, had a prolonged infection but was not hospitalized, or was hospitalized but did not require intensive care. For those who were hospitalized (but not in intensive care), the AME should forward any applicable records to the FAA after issuing the medical certificate.

AMEs must defer applications for individuals who were in intensive care or "are experiencing ongoing residual signs and/or symptoms of confirmed COVID-19." The ongoing signs and symptoms "may include but are not limited to cardiovascular dysfunction, respiratory abnormalities, kidney injury, neurological dysfunction, psychiatric conditions (e.g., depression, anxiety, moodiness), or symptoms such as fatigue, shortness of breath, cough, arthralgia, or chest pain," according to the guidance sent to AMEs. This means the AME cannot issue the medical certificate in the office and sends the completed application and any other medical records to the FAA's Aerospace Medical Certification Division. The FAA then works directly with the pilot.

The guidance comes at a time when pilots, controllers, and AMEs were unsure of how to handle medical applications that involved a history of COVID-19.

"We appreciate the FAA's scaled approach to granting medical certificates for pilots and air traffic control specialists who have had COVID-19," said AOPA Senior Vice President of Government Affairs Jim Coon. "This guidance allows AMEs to issue medical certificates for the vast majority of pilots and controllers who have had COVID-19, requiring deferral in only the most severe cases."

The FAA has previously released policies regarding the three coronavirus vaccines currently available—
PfizerBioNTech, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson. The policies require a 48-hour rest period after each dose (the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna vaccines require two shots) before resuming flying or controlling air traffic. Pilots and ATC specialists are not required to submit any documentation regarding their vaccination.

The Toledo Public Schools Aerospace & Natural Science Academy of Toledo has requested that the mighty Five Eighty Second put together a Young Eagle Rally again this year and I am itching to give airplane rides to kids so I think we should do it.

The event date is May 22nd and 23rd, 2021.

The event location will be at the ANSAT hangar at Toledo Express Airport (TOL).

The details are not finalized, but the dates are set so this email is just to get the date on your calendar and give pilots/volunteers time to make sure they are current with the EAA Youth Protection Policy and Program. https://www.eaa.org/eaa/youth/youth-protection-policy-and-program

Ground volunteers and pilots will be using the new rally management system. The EAA has established an online Young Eagle event management system that will allow us to better manage events like this. The website allows Young Eagles to pre-register online in time slots which means we can meter the number of participants coming at any one time which should help with social distancing. It worked well last year with the exception of internet access for our system. I will work on making that better so we can print right at the desk from our own printer. Here is a link to the website.

Please go to that website and familiarize yourself with it if you plan to take part in this event or any events in the future. There are instructional videos available. It does not lend itself well to open "first come/first served" events like Plane Fun, but should work well for events like this.

Pilots who want to fly Young Eagles will have to register on this website to have Young Eagles assigned to them on the day of the event.

As the pandemic is still with us, we will apply the same precautions that we did last year. This list is likely to have additions and/or modifications, but this should cover the basics.

- 1. Flights will be scheduled on an hourly basis. My initial thoughts are 3 morning flights starting at 9:00 and 3 afternoon flights starting at 1:00. The event will be pre-registered and not on a first come first served basis.
- 2. Ground volunteers will disinfect seats, headsets, and high touch surfaces after each flight (70% isopropyl will be used on those surfaces). If pilots want their windows cleaned after each flight an acrylic cleaner (like Prist) will be used (not alcohol).
- 3. Multiple layer masks will be required. Bandanas, fleece, or any single layer fabric masks will not be permitted. I may reconsider this for the pilot if that pilot has been vaccinated, but out of an abundance of caution I will request they wear a mask anyway.
- 4. We will apply some form of CDC guidelines for pre-flight health evaluation but what exact measures will be taken have not been determined.

When the details are complete, I will send out another email with a link for registration.

Pilots, be advised that I will need a firm commitment from you on your participation as the number of available seats directly affects pre-registration and scheduling.
