Flight Training Bill Clears Legislative Hurdle

September 24, 2021 – A bipartisan amendment that would reverse the FAA's recent policy on flight training has been accepted into the House version of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). The amendment, which encompasses the Certainty for General Aviation Pilots Act of 2021, would negate the FAA's recent policy that requires virtually all training in experimental, limited, and primary categories to be conducted under a letter of deviation authority (LODA) or an exemption.

The NDAA is defense funding bill with a high likelihood of passage, so it is an excellent vehicle for limited and targeted legislative language such as this flight training policy. Representatives Sam Graves (R-Missouri) and Kai Kahele (D-Hawaii) introduced the successful amendment with support from AOPA, EAA, and other associations. Focus now shifts to the Senate, where a similar amendment will help ensure that the final legislation contains the GA flight training language.

In June, the FAA confirmed that a court ruling that confirmed their interpretation of FAR 91.315 meant that no training for compensation or hire could be done in limited, experimental, and primary category aircraft without a LODA or exemption. This broke with decades of precedent and even applies to an aircraft owner receiving instruction in their own aircraft. While the FAA quickly rolled out a streamlined LODA and exemption system to accommodate this new policy, it is unnecessary, contrary to safety, and has resulted in headaches and confusion for countless pilots and CFIs.

While FAA Administrator Steve Dickson announced the FAA's intent to change the rule so that the policy would return to its previous state, the rulemaking process is a years-long ordeal. Legislation is by far the faster route to achieve this needed change.

EAA Opposes Cap on Veteran Flight Training Benefits

September 23, 2021 – EAA joined 14 other aviation organizations in jointly opposing a bill in the House of Representatives that includes a cap on flight training benefits available to United States military veterans.

H.R.4874, the bill in question, caps payments for flight training programs and virtually guarantees that U.S. veterans seeking to use their GI Bill benefits to pursue a career as a professional pilot will not

have the necessary funds provided to complete flight training. Other degree programs at public colleges or universities are not capped in a similar manner, meaning fields involving flight training are unfairly disadvantaged.

The 15 aviation groups noted in a letter sent to top House officials that they are committed to working with Congress to deliver on commitments made by the nation to its veterans, and they urged the House to remove the cap on flight training expenses.

It's Scholarship Time!

The 2022 WAI scholarship program officially opens today. Members are encouraged to visit <u>www.WAI.org/scholarships</u> and review dozens of scholarships that fit your aviation interests. Currently there are 98 scholarships totaling \$479,505 offered for flight training, engineering, maintenance, dispatcher, drones, and professional development for individuals in all stages of life. Applicants are encouraged to check for new scholarships often and may apply for up to three scholarships per year. In order to qualify for a scholarship, the applicant must be a WAI member as of October 1, 2021. The deadline for 2022 applications is Tuesday, October 12, 2021.

In 2021, WAI awarded 149 scholarships valued at \$731,805. This total includes 47 scholarships awarded through a \$250,000 Conrad N. Hilton Foundation grant. The total amount of scholarships awarded by WAI since 1995 is more than \$14.5 million.

The 2022 scholarships will be awarded during the <u>33rd Annual International Women in Aviation Conference</u> in Nashville, Tennessee, from March 17-19, 2022.




EAA Chapter 5 is located at the Geauga County Airport in Middlefield, OH. The chapter exists to:
