Top Air Show Performers Commit to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022

Some of the world's top air show performers have made commitments to fly at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022 as part of the afternoon and night air show lineups.

Those performers include aerobatic champions and longtime Oshkosh favorites for the 69th EAA fly-in convention, scheduled for July 25-31 at Wittman Regional Airport. The event features nine air shows over seven days, including night air shows on July 27 and July 30. The daily afternoon air shows are presented by Daher and Pratt & Whitney, while the Wednesday, July 27, night air show is presented by Covington Aircraft.

"This is already an outstanding all-star air show lineup and we're just getting started," said Rick Larsen, EAA's vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "There are returning performers, new air show acts, and particular aircraft connected with specific events and anniversaries. We'll be adding more exciting acts and performances in the coming weeks that will again make the nine air shows during AirVenture week unforgettable.".

Along with these early confirmations, many more exciting performers will be announced, including some onlyin-Oshkosh performers and aircraft. Exact days for each performer and complete daily air show lineups will be announced as they are finalized.

Weekly and daily admission tickets for the 69th edition of EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, EAA's annual fly-in convention, are now available online for the event at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, on July 25-31, 2022. Additional special offers and advance purchase parking passes will be available in the coming weeks.

"While we are still creating the schedule of programs, features, and attractions that will be at Oshkosh in 2022, aviation enthusiasts are already setting their plans to join us on the flightline," said Rick Larsen, EAA's vice president of communities and member programming, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "We hear from numerous families who make AirVenture tickets part of their holiday gift planning."

Again in 2022, all attendees ages 18 and under are admitted free, supported in part by The Boeing Company. In addition, EAA members who purchase admissions prior to June 15, 2022, are eligible to receive their admission wristbands in advance via the Express Arrival program. Early purchase discounts are also available on both daily and weekly admissions. (COLUMBUS, OHIO – January 10, 2022) Two international leaders in flight – Ohio-based companies NetJets and FlightSafety International (FSI) – jointly announced today a six-figure commitment to the non-profit Ohio Air & Space Hall of Fame and Learning Center (OAS) through an investment totaling \$225,000. This is the first investment of its type.

OAS is in the middle of a multi-phase, multi-million dollar fundraising campaign to renovate the original Port Columbus air terminal and tower into its home. The joint gift from NetJets and FSI will be used to unlock \$550,000 with a state matching grant, allowing OAS to begin construction on phase one of its plan. The 12,000-square-foot, three-story structure, dedicated in 1929 and on the National Register of Historic Places, is located on the southeast corner of what is now John Glenn International Airport (CMH).

When completed, OAS will recognize NetJets as the presenter of its "Founders Walk," a series of exterior public displays heralding the original terminal's historic significance and recognizing the key local and national leaders responsible for its creation. NetJets, the world's largest private jet company, was founded at CMH in 1964 as Executive Jet Aviation (EJA) and originally headquartered in Port Columbus Hangar One, located several hundred feet from the original terminal. EJA co-founder, the late Air Force Brig. Gen. Paul Tibbets, Jr., will ultimately be among the individuals honored at OAS.

FSI, the world's premier professional aviation training company and supplier of flight simulators, will be recognized as the named presenter of two flight simulator stations planned for OAS, with each station featuring a pair of simulators. One station will be available to the public among the first-floor OAS exhibits and displays featuring air and space pioneers from the state of Ohio. The second station will serve the aviationthemed Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math (AvSTEAM) youth learning center housed on the second floor of the OAS. As part of its support, FSI will further assist OAS in the selection and operation of the simulators.

The Ohio Air & Space Hall of Fame and Learning Center is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization with the mission of highlighting the state's men and women pioneers of flight, using their colorful legacies to help develop the skilled workforce and inspire the future innovation essential to keeping Ohio a leader in technology and aerospace.

The phase one goal of the OAS capital campaign is to commence renovation of the terminal in 2022. Upon completion, phase two will follow, raising additional funds to fully complete the project and OAS staffing, operations, and programming needs.

OAS Executive Director Ron Kaplan said, "On behalf of our Board of Trustees and our many donors and partners providing early support to this worthy project, I thank global industry leaders NetJets and FlightSafety International for their robust commitment to our vital mission. We look forward to working closely with them to educate the aviation leaders of the future and ensure Ohio's dominance in the world of aviation and aerospace."

"We appreciate the opportunity to invest in the Ohio Air & Space organization and hopefully help inspire the next generation of leaders in aviation—right here in our hometown," –said Adam Johnson, NetJets, Chairman and CEO.

Three Trailblazing Women to be Enshrined



In a recent announcement, the National Aviation Hall of Fame announced its 2022 Enshrinement Class. Of the five individuals, the International Women's Air & Space Museum is ecstatic to share that three are women including: Willa Brown, Margaret Hamilton, and Jerrie Mock.

Willa Brown

As a young woman, **Willa Brown** was inspired by Bessie Coleman's achievements. Willa became the first African American woman to earn a commercial pilot's license in the United States in 1937. She was also the only woman in the U.S. to concurrently hold a mechanic's license and a commercial pilot's license. She later, in 1946, became the first African American woman to run for Congress. In 1937, she co-founded the National Airmen's

Association of America with Cornelius R. Coffey to promote African American participation in aviation. They also founded the Coffey School of Aeronautics in 1938 which trained over 200 pilots including some of the future Tuskegee Airmen. Willa's career was aviation, but her legacy was the education of young African

Americans who dreamed of becoming aviators.

Brown successfully petitioned the U.S.

Government to integrate the Army Air Corps,

and became the first African American woman to

be commissioned as an officer in the Illinois Civil Air Patrol.



Margaret Hamilton

Considered one of the first computer software programmers, **Margaret Hamilton** is credited with coining the term software engineer to describe her work. While studying mathematics and philosophy at Earlham College in Richmond, IN, she met James Hamilton, and they subsequently married. After graduating in 1958, she and her husband moved to Boston where she accepted a position at MIT. It was there that she began programming software to predict the weather and did postgraduate work in meteorology. She also worked at MIT's Instrumentation Laboratory providing aeronautical technology for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). For her work on the in-flight command and lunar modules of the Apollo missions, she focused on the software to detect system errors and to recover information in a computer crash. Both focuses proved crucial in the Apollo 11 mission in 1969 which landed Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin on the moon.

Geraldine "Jerrie" Mock

Geraldine "Jerrie" Mock was born in central Ohio in 1925, and from an early age was fascinated with flight. Her passion for aviation carried her to Ohio State University in Columbus where she became one of the first female aeronautical engineering students. While she left school to care for her family, her love of flying was never far from her mind. Like many others during her life and since, Mock was inspired by the one and only Amelia Earhart. It was with that drive and determination that Mock set out from Port Columbus Airport on March 19, 1964, to achieve what Earhart never did. After 29 days, 21 stopovers and almost 22,860 miles, Jerrie Mock became the first woman to circumnavigate the world.

When asked by *Air and Space Magazine* 50 years later about her record-setting accomplishment Mock was quoted as saying, "There were women who told me that they flew because of me. I'm glad I did what I did, because I had a wonderful time."





EAA's local Chapters 1095 is about people, bringing together individuals interested in learning more about aviation as well as sharing their own knowledge.

Chapter members are involved in a variety of social and educational activities, including Young Eagles rallies, fly-ins, building seminars, and more, to build awareness in the community.


