Showing a Friend, the Utility of Aviation

I had an opportunity to help a friend, who is working on his private pilot's license, experience what it will be like after he completes his quest. I received a call that he wanted to go to a small-town Coaling, Alabama for a quick 30-45 minute meeting. He asked if it would be possible to fly there? All us pilots all need to stay current and as the saying goes any excuse to go flying is usually a good one. I looked up where Coaling is. It is about ½ way between Bessemer and Tuscaloosa. Coaling has a population of about 1600 people and is so small it is not even on a sectional. I let him know I had some free time and love flying, so it was a great idea.

I checked FBOs at both Tuscaloosa and Bessemer and planned the flight. We met at KDNL at 7:30 am. Since he is working on his PPL we took a bit of time to discuss the preparations I did to plan the flight. We were in the air about 8am for the flight. Straight line distance is about 250 NM, my initial flight planning days before had us flying for a little over 2 hours. The day we picked mother nature decided to hit us with a 20-25 knot head wind. Even though the weather was clear I filled IFR. We had a great flight over and a fast flight back. The tailwind was even better up higher.

During the flights debrief some of the takeaways for by buddy were:

- Flying will allow you to get somewhere and home in the same day, that you may turn into a 2 day trip if driving.
- Flying into an airport and "grabbing" a courtesy car is very easy and pretty cool.
- Make sure to tell the FBO you should be back within 2 hours so you can use the courtesy car rather than having to get a rental. (we had it about 2 hour 20 min.)
- Talking and listening to ATC doesn't look very scary 😉
- Headwinds and tailwinds can change with altitude
- Watching traffic slowed down on the interstates is cool, even with a 25 Knot headwind
- Even though your original flight planning gives you an idea of how long the flight will be it will depend on what the weather is actually doing.

We had a great time. Enjoyed being able to do something that most people can't do. Had a nice lunch somewhere 250 miles from home and we were home by dinner time.
