September 11th gathering will be at Pea Patch Aerodrome at Noon: Our presentation: is on drones by Jim O'Keefe.

Jim holds Single Engine Land, Instrument Ratings, Remote Pilot Certificate ratings. He has owned a Cessna 172. Jim served as a FAAST Team member at KBDR in Bridgeport CT. He is involved in the Remote Pilot Programs and the Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems sUAS movement. As a Police Officer, he developed and implemented the sUAS program and acquired the necessary documents for our Certificates of Waiver or Authorization. Jim also teaches for Dartdrones (Drone Training System) and helps departments and individuals prepare for and pass the Remote Pilot 107 Test. He also helps teach and train how to use different types of drones in Search and Rescue.

Member Spotlight: - Charles Lewis:

Commander Charles Samuel Lewis, USN

Charles grew up in Louisville and graduated from Louisville Academy in 1966. After graduation from the United States Naval Academy in 1970, Charles completed Navy Dive School in Key West, Fl, graduating first in his class. He then entered Navy Pilot training in Pensacola, Fl and Meridian, Ms and earned his Naval Aviator jet wings of gold in Beeville, Tx in February of 1972. Charles just missed combat flying in Viet Nam and Desert Storm and loves to say, "the only country I ever bombed was Arizona!"

During his first tour at the Naval Air Test Center in Patuxent River, Md. and later with VRF-31 in Norfolk, Va., Charles flew many types of prop, jet, and rotary wing aircraft. Operational tours included: Attack Squadron-75 at Oceana, Va., flying the A-6 Intruder, and Tactical Electronic Warfare Squadron -138 at Whidbey Island, Wa., flying the EA-6B Prowler. Charles was qualified as an Air Combat Maneuvering Instructor and an Airwing Strike Leader.

Additionally, Charles served two tours at Naval Air Station Pensacola, Florida as a jet flight instructor; special qualifications included Spin and Out of Control Flight Instructor, Aerial Gunnery Instructor, and Post Maintenance Test Pilot. His last fleet tour was aboard USS Nimitz from '88-'90, in charge of the Flight and Hangar Decks. In a 23-year Navy career, CDR Lewis has accumulated over 6000 flight hours in 35 different aircraft types and has logged 587 carrier arrested landings on six aircraft carriers.

In 1992, Charles earned a Master's Degree in Management from Troy State University. Charles retired as Director of the Navy's prestigious Aviation Officer Candidate School in Pensacola in July 1993. He taught NJROTC for five years at Fairhope High School in Alabama; then for eleven years as the Senior Naval Science Instructor at Jefferson County High School's Navy Junior ROTC, retiring from teaching in 2009.

He was married 33 years to Jere Elaine Wasden of Wadley, Ga.; they have been triply blessed with three children: Jonathan Samuel, Joy Meadows, and Matthew William. Jere passed away of cancer in 2003. Charles married Susanne Smith, his high school flame, in December 2004. Susanne has two daughters: Laurel and Merritt. They are blessed with 7 beautiful and talented grand-children.

Spare time in retirement is filled with church and community service, as well as travel, scuba diving, sailing, backpacking, pickleball, cycling and kayaking. Always an adventurer, Charles has taught many skills as a certified instructor, including flight, scuba, swimming and sailing. He has been active in local community theater for 20 years as an actor and director. He has been volunteering as a U.S. Naval Academy Blue and Gold Officer for 12 years, assisting the Admissions Department with candidate interviews and mentoring.

Charles flew a tandem powered parachute around the Louisville area for ten years. "Low and slow is a different world for a tactical jet pilot". Lately, he may be seen flying his aerobatic airplane, an experimental Vans RV-6A "Pegasus", which he flew to WA, CA and Oshkosh (for the first time) this summer. He has been a member of EAA Chapter 172 for about ten years and loves introducing others to the joy and freedom of flight through EAA's Eagle Flight Program.
