#### My First Visit to EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh

Going to Oshkosh (EAA AirVenture) had been a dream of mine, a bucket list item. Finally this year we made plans to go. Filled with tips and suggestions from various chapter members, my husband and I decided to camp in a tent for the full week. Ronna and Jim found room for us to camp near them among the Homebuilders Area volunteers, and even carried some of our gear in their RV. Our tickets arrived in the mail and off we flew commercial to Milwaukee.

People said the Oshkosh event was huge, but I didn't understand the true scope until I was there. Wow! Acres of aircraft of all designs and ages, city-block-sized exhibit areas, entire fields of outdoor classrooms, a market area bigger than downtown Augusta and a campground that would rival the size of a Disney theme park (thought definitely NOT like a theme park). And everywhere there were thousands of people walking, gathering in groups or pausing to watch aircraft fly overhead. My Fitbit recorded over 100,000 steps that week, even though I managed to catch rides on golf carts as often as possible.

EAA provided an app on my phone that gave a previous of the events and seminar schedule so I was able to pre-select ones of interest, plus it had maps that I frequently checked to help me navigate. Each afternoon had an airshow, and the week included two night airshows choreographed with music and fireworks, plus impromptu ultralight and STOL aircraft demos. I was in heaven! The best part of Oshkosh week is the airplanes, of course, but the camaraderie from thousands of pilots and aviation enthusiasts experiencing this amazing week with me was beyond compare. I talked with retired veterans, GA pilots from all walks of life (and countries), volunteers, airline and aircraft vendor personnel, and locals who came for the spectacle. In the seminars at the EAA Blue Barn, I met people from other chapters and swapped ideas. I met a couple who flew their Cessna 170 from Canada and we reunited with old friends from the International Cessna 170 organization at their welcome dinner. I even had lunch with the several Chapter 172 members and former member Alex LaFave. Somehow I missed seeing people from my former Chapter 240 and new Chapter 172 member Roger Kubeck although I did see their Facebook posts.



EAA AirVenture 2023 was an amazing experience! I have so many memories—like singing "Sweet Caroline" with thousands of spectators awaiting the fireworks show to resume, or gathering with thousands of female pilots in Boeing Square for a group photo, or watching a demo of the coolest eVTOL aircraft, or walking through the EAA museum (which had a phenomenal collection), or seeing the Guppy aircraft land while marveling at how on earth an aircraft like that could fly. And now I have a new collection of tee-shirts to commemorate that AirVenture week to wear when I return next year.

## **EAA Museum Highlight**

The EAA Museum at Oshkosh was fabulous (and it had air conditioning). In addition to their exhibit of the full line of Vans aircraft, another exhibit displayed a full-sized replica of SpaceShipOne. Each hour the tail of the aircraft folds and unfolds as a video plays of pilot Mike Melvill describing the sights and sounds of his recordbreaking flight on October 4, 2004 which captured the \$10 million X Prize.



From eaa.com: The exhibit uses dramatic sound and lighting effects, as well as rare video footage - some never seen in public - to tell the story of a mission into space aboard SpaceShipOne. During this journey, SpaceShipOne demonstrates a key technological breakthrough conceived by spacecraft designer Burt Rutan, a longtime EAA member.

To safely re-enter the atmosphere without excessive heating, SpaceShipOne hinges in half, completely changing the shape of the vehicle. This amazing physical transformation, which "feathers" the spacecraft for re-entry, will occur before museum visitors' eyes every hour on the hour.

A complete set of spacecraft components were fabricated at Scaled Composites in Mojave, Calif., whose staff volunteered to complete the project under the supervision of the world's first civilian spacecraft pilot, longtime EAA member Mike Melvill.



#### WHERE TO FIND US:

EAA172 meets every 2nd Saturday of the month at several locations around Augusta, GA throughout the year. However, our primary meeting place is at our chapter clubhouse on Pea Patch Aerodrome (61GA) in Blythe, GA. Take Route 1 toward Blythe, turn south at the Citgo/Quik Mart station onto Bath-Edie Road. At the first intersection, turn right onto Patterson Road and follow 1/4 mile. Make a left turn onto Boulineau Road (across from the Rec Center) and drive 1 mile. The entrance to Pea Patch is on your right. The clubhouse is at the end of a row of hangars next to the grass strip, just south of the windsock. Pea Patch Aerodrome CTAF is 122.80.
