Business Meeting

The chapter meeting was called to order at 0900 by Jeff Kaloostian. We had 6 visitors attending our chapter.

Old Business

Meeting Minutes:

Meeting minutes were emailed in Smoke Signals and posted to the chapter website. With no amendments to the minutes, a motion was made, seconded without objection to accept the published meeting minutes.

Treasurers Report

Dave Presnell presented a verbal treasurers report on our chapter. A motion was made, seconded without objection to accept the Treasurer's report.

New Business

Jeff reminded the chapter that there is a continuing decline in the number of new private pilots, mechanics, and ATC personnel. To help in maintaining and growing personnel numbers AOPA will soon hold a conference at Sun'n Fun to institute a national effort to stop the trend of declining numbers.

Denny gave an update on the chapter programs in the queue. Please remember that due to the proximity of Christmas, there will be NO DECEMBER EAA 175 MEETING.

With no additional business, a motion was made, seconded and adopted without objection to close the business meeting at 0915.

Chapter Program

Our speaker was Phil Lockwood, designer and manufacturer of Aircam kit aircraft. Phil presented an interesting program about the events leading up to and efforts to deploy Aircam #1 into the rain forest of Africa on a photo shoots for the National Geographic in an article called "Survivors of the Skeleton Coast".

Phil was flying single engine aircraft (Drifter) at the time he was approached for the rain forest project and presented with the risks of that project; he chose to build Aircam #1. He had it only in concept but as required, he and his team built the first Aircam#1 in 6 months. It was shipped to the Congo at a cost of \$24,000. There being no landing strips, and 100% coverage of trees, Phil convinced the promoters to carve out a 600 foot strip to land and take off his Aircam. Navigation was a problem, and as Phil said "thank goodness for GPS" as there were no nav aids, just visual pilotage which is nearly impossible. No landmarks other than rivers and overgrown logging trails. If you go down in the rain forest, you are not likely to make it out, even should you survive a crash. No one will find you. Phil described his first 450 mile trip across the rain forest. It was not an easy flight requiring an intermediate stop where gas could only be purchased from black-marketers.

At Phil's base of operation, ants were an issue. Little critters, but they come in huge numbers, maybe millions, in a 30 foot wide, 1000's of feet long, devouring anything and everything in their path, including tents, people, and wildlife. Only hope of survival is to jump into and stay in the river until they pass. Other hazards at the base camp along the Sangha River include malaria. Everyone was bitten by malaria born mosquitos. Most residence just tried to survive. Phil's team had medications to combat catching the disease and fortunately, all made it home without malaria.

The project was a success, and Phil carried his plans forward to manufacturing the Aircam as kit planes. Currently there are 220 Aircams in the field. Most of the completed Aircams are used for recreation.

Phil gave a brief report of the status of Light Sport Aircraft saying that there are over 3,000 flying LSAs. He felt that the market was healthy and it provides a good alternative to new general aviation aircraft due to price, operational cost, and maintenance. The two most popular LSAs current on the market are produced by Flight Design, and Cub Crafter.

Phil Lockwood concluded his presentation at 1020. The chapter members proceeded to Volo Aviation to view Phil's Aircam parked on the FBO ramp.


