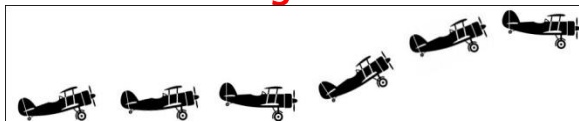

Old Business

Meeting Minutes: Steve Reisser stated that the March meeting minutes were emailed as a supplement to the standard placement in Smoke Signals. A motion to accept the minutes as emailed to the membership. The motion was seconded.

Treasurers Report: Don Miller, Treasurer, provided a verbal statement of the current banking balance and expenses. A motion was made to accept the treasurer's report, and was seconded. The motion was accepted as passed without objection.

New Business

Future Events

EAA 175 is planning a June 22nd Young Eagles event at Peter O'Knight Airport for the children of deployed military personnel. Derrick from Atlas Aviation stated that he was happy to host our Chapter even and will provide a conference room to stage our flights, a gas grill for cooking, and will supply a large iced cooler for drinks. His personnel will assist in ramp control of aircraft. Atlas Aviation will discount their fuel price by \$1 for Young Eagle pilots.

Shirts

Silver Lady

The Ercoupe is working well. There is a future project to re-cover the wings. Richard stated he has been experimenting on the wings to remove cracked paint.

At 9:15 AM, with no other new business being provided, a motion was made to close the business portion of the meeting. The motion was seconded and accepted as passed without objection.

Program

Richard Ilfeld provided an interesting aviation program on tools for your desktop and notebook computer to not only fly airplanes, but also to emulate and enhance your experimental aircraft designs. Richard showed us the basic features of "X-Plane". He demonstrated how it was used to reproduce and fly the Silver Lady and the aircraft he is building, an Osprey.

X-Plane is a flight and design simulator design for MAC OS X, but is also available for Windows and Linux produced by Laminar Research. X-Plane is packaged with several commercial, military and other aircraft as well as basic global scenery. X-Plane also has a plug-in architecture that allows users to create their own modules, extending the functionality of the software by letting users create their own worlds or replicas of places on Earth.

Real world performance of designed aircraft is not perfect, default forces are "twitchy", but can be dampened. The software is good enough to be useful to actual designers, and to be approved by the FAA for support training permitted simulators, in particular.

There is a "free" version of this software but limits the user to a 15 minute session. You can find a downloadable version at <http://www.X-Plane.org> Be aware that the manufacturer suggests high end requirements as follows:

CPU: 2Ghz dual-core (minimum), 3Ghz Multi-core (recommended). Video Card: 256Mb dedicated (min), 1Gb VRAM recommended,. 2GB RAM (Min), 4GB RAM recommended. Without the recommended

hardware (especially a high speed graphic accelerator, performance can be slow. Even at that, this is a great design tool.

A global edition, version 10, on the website is priced at \$69.99. The previous version of X-Plane, version 9, is also available at \$39.99. There is a "Professional Version" for the tidy cost of \$750 that includes necessary certification standards as required by the FAA for large simulators.

There are lots of aircraft types that come standard with the \$69.99 version of software, but what is great is that you can share, or receive flyable, and re-designable, aircraft that are not on the standard package. Importing new aircraft is fairly simple. You can also modify and enhance topography to create the environment you want to fly. Some places you can download extras are...

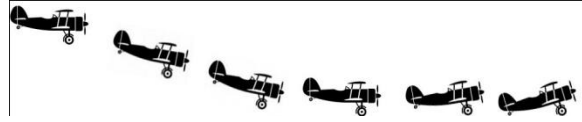
