FROM THE BACK SEAT

The first weekend in March I flew my Aeronca Champ, the back numbing 46 NM from Zephyrhills Municipal to 12 Oaks Airport (5FL7) to attend the EAA Chapter 1484 Spring Fly In. The weather was absolutely beautiful and, aside from the 15knot headwind which made semi-trucks on the highway look like an RV8 flying past me, the trip was a beautiful jaunt. Twelve Oaks airport is a flying community with houses bordering the 100'X2,000' runway. Nestled in the trees at the end of the lake Tsala Apopka north of Inverness it can be a little tough to see at 1,000 MSL...my maximum cruising altitude. Remembering what my first instructor told me; 'when time runs out and the airport is not in sight, look straight down," viola, Twelve Oaks! I announced my position, flew a left arc, and slipped over the

trees for a smooth touchdown on the grass of Runway 9...I was the tenth airplane to arrive. With my \$10 food donation made I was able to see a superb arrival airshow. Antiques and Classics came to light on the grass; Waco UPF7s, PT22, PT19, a Waco Cabin, 1945 J3 cubs (3 each), a 1956 Cessna "straight tail" 172 tailwheel conversion with a Lycoming IO360 power plant, and a YAK 52 from Russia (yes it was a Russian airplane visiting) came for the show. Then the homebuilts arrived; RVs of all types, gyrocopters galore (from Zephyrhills of course), EAA Acro Sports I and II, Pietenpol Air Camper, and a 1940 homebuilt Sparrow Hawk biplane all came to roost. In all there were about 60 aircraft on the field. The pilot talk was great and the flying stories even better. After lunch it was a mass exodus. I stayed on the ground until the majority had departed to get additional photos. Really, I am too cheap to sit in line burning gas waiting for a departure slot just so the crowd can see me wave to them on takeoff. With the 7AC's prop spinning the 65hp Continental made short work getting us airborne and on the way home to Zephyrhills--45 minutes later I was sipping a cold soda in my hangar. In all a great day.

The 12 Oaks fly in is one of many that will occur over the next 3-4 months, so get out and fly. While you are at it take some pictures for the website (www.175.eaachapter.org) or Facebook page...we need to see your flying activities.

Speaking of activities, here are some of the upcoming programs.

On 22 April, we can expect Steve Ritzi to discuss the Reno air races. Steve will give us a rundown on the future of the Unlimited Class and how he is working towards racing his Cassutt. This will be a great show from one of our local aviators.

The 27 May 17 meeting we plan to host Air Commodore (AUS) Micka Gray who will give us the skinny on flying the General Dynamics F111 around the world and in combat. This will be a great time to meet one our Australian partners and hear about his flying exploits.

In Jun we are looking at a flying cook out at the Chapter where we ask those with aircraft to offer opportunities for all members to experience the freedom of flight. More on this in the next few months.

Old Business

New Business

Sun'n Fun Volunteer Kitchen. Rich Denton addressed our chapter regarding dates and needs for volunteers at the upcoming Fun 'N Sun Fly In. We have the distinguished honor of providing lunches for all of the volunteers. Today Rich gave out the sign-up sheets for those wanting credentials to participate in the kitchen. Chapter Program

Our program today was presented by Barry Ford of "Wing Waxers" on keeping you airplanes (and cars) looking like new.

How to Detail you 2nd most expensive asset.

DEBUG

Get a "California Car Duster" and sweep it across the surfaces of your plane or car. This will remove particulate matter. Dusters can be purchased at Walmart for about \$15. For removing love bugs put Dryer Sheet over the love bug area, let it set for a few minutes, and remove the sheets to rid the surface of those acidic critters

DEGREASE

Use an industry sized sponge to wipe down and wipe clean with a clean cloth to remove any grease from your airplane, car or boat. Formula 88 Cleaner and Degreaser(see photo) is the best product. Use protective gloves and safety classes. When you do the belly of an aircraft wear old clothes you don't object to throwing away.

DEOX (Deoxydation)

This is an exfoliation process which smooths uneven surfaces to make your vehicle shine. You will have a slick smooth finish on your equipment. This reduces parasite drag on your aircraft and provide a bit more speed as well as make it shine. It is almost like applying 3,500 grade sandpaper to the

surface. Apply the cream in 24 inch squares, let it haze, then wash it off. Autogeek sells it under the name of CTI ProPaint Care (see photo)

SHINE IT: USE TEFLON

Instead of wax, use Dupont Teflon. Waxes are organic and susceptible to UV degradation. Teflon will NOT degrade due to UV and provides a stronger bond than wax.

BELLY: Consider using a DEOX-TEFLON COMBO. Hard to clean areas on the belly will take additional elbow grease to get off. Do Not despair, just keep applying the cleaner and scrubbing until the surface is clean

ENGINE CLEAN: Suggest using methylated spirits instead of a high pressure wash. Denny suggested "staterd solution" PLEXIGLASS: Use Maguire's Mirror Glaze.

NOTE: DON'T EVER USE ARMORALL ON PLASTIC PARTS ASIT SUCK OUT ALL THE MOSITURE CAUSING THE PLASTIC TO CRACK PREMATURELY!

. DO NOT USE ANY FORM OF SILICON ON OR NEAR PAINTED SURFACES AS IT WILL BE VERY DIFFICULT TO REPAINT THE CONTAMINATED SURFACE IN THE FUTURE.

- a. Here's what I have sorted so far:
 - i. AN Bolts: 3-4, 4-5, 5-10, 6-20 thru 3-11, 4-56, 5-60, 6-60
 - ii. no fewer than 8 of each when considered in groups of 3/16, ie 4-16, 4-17, 4-18 is a group.
 - iii. AN stop nuts, nylon inserts, AN stop nuts, Metal, AN castle nuts High and low profile, and AN plain nuts in all sizes

- iv. AN machine bolts, 8, & 10 32 lengths 4 through about 60
- v. AN machine nuts nylock mostly
- vi. A good variety of plain and lock washers
- vii. [if you need a few nuts, bolts, washers it's probably available -- that's the majority of the collection]
- viii. A lot of standard rivets, and blind rivet nuts and many sizes.
 - ix. Some Cherry and blind rivets (not pop rivets)
 - x. Several specialty bolts such as hex head or close tolerance
 - xi. An assortment of camlocks and camlock parts.
- xii. Some pitot static fittings
- xiii. A Huge assortment of ear nuts
- xiv. An assortment of small 12 V lamps
- xv. An assortment of flying wire hardware
- xvi. A large variety of specialty fittings like

- blind latches, post lights, etc.
- xvii. Assorted clecos and more
- xviii. There is a lot of stuff I haven't even gone through it yet. As I mentioned, I had a similar collection of my own and
- b. So here's the deal; My position is that over the years I probably spent 3-4 hundred dollars on assortments and parts bags at flymarkets, and the donors to EAA have done at least that, plus tools. I've used parts over the years that would have been several thousand dollars at retail. And I've used a fair number of parts in the shop just because I had them. I see no reason the chapters would want to try to limit folks to using the parts on an airplane. It's not a sin to put an AN part on a lawn mower.
 - i. I will take email requests from members for parts for their projects or airplanes. I prefer email to phone, but if you are in the middle of something and need a part now- I won't hang up.

c. Visitors are welcome at the shop, of course. And the parts are much better organized for browsing that they were before.

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
