On Saturday April 16, one of the largest gatherings of TBMs took place in Peru Illinois. It was said that on that Saturday 10 of 15 flying TBMs converged onto Illinois Valley Regional Airport. The Mud Hens were invited to come help with this event. The Mud Hens, of course were Joe and Bill van der Sanden,



with Dom Ruggeri as honorary Mud Hen. If you don't know why they are called The Mud Hens you have not been in Chapter 18 long enough J.

The airport has as main runway 18-36. There is one taxiway, splitting the runway in half, from the main apron and T hangars. Another taxiway goes from this taxiway to the south end of 18-36, but one needs to back taxi to the north end of 18-36. Of course prevailing winds that day dictated back taxi to the





north end which gave rise to some interesting taxi problems, especially when G.A. airplanes decided to arrive en-masse, and decided to use the first taxiway to get off, the very same taxiway where the departures were waiting to get on to back taxi. This caused a backup on 18-36 and a flurry of goarounds, but we managed to sort things out.

We very quickly overflowed the designated GA parking areas and had to push into service some unused grasslands around the airport for additional plane parking. This cre-
