 FAA Announces 149 ATC Tower Closures On Friday March 22, the FAA listed all the towers to be closed starting April 7th. The

list includes 8 towers in Wisconsin including: Mosinee, Eau Claire, Kenosha, Janesville, La Crosse, Milwaukee Timmerman, Oshkosh and Waukesha. Sean Elliott, EAA's vice president of advocacy and safety said Friday "While we're disappointed to learn of the Wittman tower closure, it's important for everyone to understand that air traffic operations during and surrounding AirVenture will not be adversely affected."

wrapped in cardboard, they arrived in remarkably good shape, as close inspection revealed. These pieces of straight grain spruce are absolutely spectacular and free of any flaws. It's no wonder that these four pieces of prime lumber set me back four figures, but I have a great deal of confidence in their quality, and having that level of confidence in the main structural piece of your airplane is hard to put a price tag on.

EAA; it was a set of wing spars! Even though they shipped via UPS

Having the spars in hand allowed me to tackle a couple of tasks that I had been putting off, such as fabricating the fuselage attach brackets. Finally, on March the 4th, it was time to start assembling the wing. Those of you who have built airplanes know that visible progress is often achieved in fits and starts. You can spend six months working on it and it doesn't look any more like an airplane than it did six months ago. Then, all of a sudden, whammo! In the space of a day or so, your pile of parts has morphed into an airplane. March 4th was one of those days, as I built a jig to hold the spars and began stringing the ribs onto them. By the end of the day, I had what looked for all the world like an airplane wing! It still needed a lot of work, but it looked like a wing! That sort of visible progress is invaluable in keeping the motivation going on a long term project like this, and all of you builders know just what I mean.

Until next month, keep your airspeed up and your eye on the ball.

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#### FAA Announces 149 ATC Tower Closures

In Winnebago County, local officials are discussing options to continue year-round tower service at Wittman, which has had air traffic control facilities for a half-century. "We will work with the airports and the operators to ensure the procedures are in place to maintain the high level of safety at non-towered airports," said FAA Administrator Michael Huerta in a news release announcing the tower closures Friday afternoon.

Waukesha is looking into alternate funding to keep the tower open also. Kurt Stanich, Waukesha County Airport Manager stated in a special Waukesha County Newsletter email, "Airport management and county officials are continuing to explore contingency options to keep the tower open. We will, of course, let you know if we are able to find a solution. We also ask you to join us in supporting our air traffic controllers, who have served us so well. We truly appreciate their dedication to Waukesha County Airport and the aviation community." Kurt also said "We are likely to see less corporate traffic at the airport as corporate flight departments and charter/fractional operations evaluate safety options along their routes. All other operations should continue as usual, however, we ask that all airport businesses keep us informed of any concerns they may have as these changes become a reality."

AOPA President Craig Fuller said in a posting on their website "AOPA is extremely disappointed that the Federal Aviation Administration has taken the unnecessary and unprecedented step of closing a third of the nation's 515 air traffic control towers, some of them newly built at a cost of millions of taxpayer dollars. This is no time for politics. These towers were put into operation to ensure aviation safety. By closing them, the same organization responsible for ensuring the safety of our skies is compromising that safety."

One of the towers slated for closure is at Lakeland Linder Regional Airport in Lakeland, Fla., home to Sun 'n Fun. The show, often considered a spring break for pilots, is scheduled to start April 8, one day after contract towers across the country will begin closing. Sun 'n Fun President John "Lites" Leenhouts issued a statement shortly after the FAA released its lists of cuts, stating that FAA air traffic controllers would ensure "safe and expeditious handling of all arrivals and departures at Lakeland Linder Airport" during the show, April 8 through 15.
