Scholarship Update



Chapter 18 Ray Aviation Scholar, Owen Robinson, provides this update:

Finally, on December 26th I was able to fly again after about a month of not being able to go up. I was able to complete my first cross-country flight from Waukesha to Oshkosh and back. It was great to get back up and brush the rust off, although my landing in Oshkosh was a bit rough I was able to tidy it up on the landing back in Waukesha. I also got my first experience with working with VFR flight following using Milwaukee's approach and departure. Thankfully the weather cooperated with me, however on the flight back some clouds started to pop up at our cruising altitude, we had to bit of dodging clouds but it was a very smooth flight. I also got to fly again in early January to get some review on flight maneuvers such as slow flight, stalls, steep turns, etc., and that helped to get me to feel and fly like how I did in November. Through these flights, I have been able to test out my new Zulu 3 headset that I received from the Ray Aviation Foundation and Lightspeed Aviation Foundation, and the worked very well, the audio was very clear and the noise-canceling helped me to save my hearing a little bit throughout the flights. Coming up I am looking to get more experience back that I missed throughout the final months of 2021, and I am looking to get another cross-country flight from Waukesha to Manitowoc to Appleton and back, completing my first 150 nm flight, then on to solo cross-country flights. I am very excited to get back in the air as the weather begins to cooperate more and to fly to other airports that aren't near me.

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Bill Stilley

Bill Stilley was an active member of EAA Chapter 18. Bill served as Vice President and was also a Board member. Our Treasurer, Jim Hatzenbeller remembers Bill:

Bill, worked full time at Astronautics developing instrumentation for military aircraft and later commercial airliners. He worked for them for over 40 plus years. Many years, he served as the Santa Claus at the annual Astronautics Christmas party.

His training was in the Aero Shop at Milwaukee's "Boys Tech.," plus what he has picked up in decades of home-building full scale aircraft, and restoring commercially made single engine planes. Bill served in the US Air Force (1950s), and ended up in a development engineering career of highly technical products, He did that at one place of employment (Astronautics), and did it with less than a 4 year college degree.

Bill was also into modeling before he was ten years old, and took advantage of the model shops found at most larger US Air Bases. He was in "R/C" before it was reliable. Bill served as president of the RAMS R/C club for 4 years.

Bill was a big-city boy all his life. Bill grew up near 15th and Highland in Milwaukee and attended What was then called Boy's Tech in Milwaukee. Bill's Air Force draftsman career was hands on with aircraft (Fort Belvoire, Virginia), During his Air Force time, Bill was stationed in Greenland. Bill was an active pilot, has built or restored a dozen aircraft, and has worked in aircraft instrumentation.

One thing that brought Bill back into modeling in 1994 was the hangering of his aircraft at Rainbow Airport before the County closed it. Rainbow Airport was just north of the RAMS R/C flying field.

Bill developed tonsil cancer in the late 90's, which resulted in removal of lymph nodes in his neck. Bill feels he beat the Big C. However, the radiation treatments left his neck skin sensitive to sunburn, which accounted for the familiar large hat he was seen wearing many times.

After his retirement from Astronautics, Bill could be found most weekends at Capitol Dr. Airport where he worked in the office.

Throughout his lifetime Bill owned several different airplanes. He once owned an Ercoupe. Later he owned a Cessna 150 Sparrow Hawk, and a Cessna 172. He built and flew a Kit Fox. Then to make it back full circle, he restored and flew another Ercoupe.

Bill leaves behind his wife Teri, who was always supportive of his aviation projects.
