

ADS-B - To paraphrase Marvin The Paranoid Android (if you don't know who that is, Google it and then read the books!). Anyway, to paraphrase - 'ADS-B, loath it or ignore it, you can't like it!' Actually, I do like it having had Out and In when I had my Starduster and having In now and waiting for my Uavionix Tailbeacon to get the Out functionality. But, I digress, so do you know how it works? Do you know all the rules? I thought I did until we had a discussion at Sikeston and I came home and did more research. 30NM hockey puck for ground station transmitted TIS-B for non-ADS-B Out equipped aircraft with SSR/ATC processed transponder signals sent by wire to the ADS-B ground tower. Ground towers have to be triggered by an ADS-B Out signal (yours or someone else's) to send TIS-B. ADS-B is direct aircraft to aircraft ADS-B Out to ADS-B In. And then there is 1090 as well... very confusing. We also have to be aware that outside of Class A,B and C airspace, any Mode C veil, and below 10,000 feet it is not a requirement (yet), so in Class D thru G below 10,000 feet, you won't see every aircraft within ADS-B range because they may not have a transponder (so no TIS-B) or ADS-B Out, so no direct

Also, what about transponder exempt aircraft? Actually, the current view is that the same exemption rules apply to ADS-B Out for all those non-electric (engine replenished) aircraft, so you don't need it. Check out Federal Regs 14 CFR 91.225 and CFR 91.227 or Sporty's Facebook page which has a good report on the requirements.

A quick anecdote on ADS-B from the Sikeston trip. I was flying with Eddie Brewer in his Kitfox and had my new Stratux ADS-B hooked up to my iPad with WingX. Cruising along I saw a target on the iPad 300 feet below us on the same course and at the same speed. We turned right and it stayed beneath us, we turned left and it stayed beneath us; we saw nothing in sight on either turn so we decided it was ghost image of some sort. It wasn't, it was our transponder signal being sent out from the ground tower TIS-B and picked up by my ADS-B In. But why was it showing 300 feet lower? I think I know, do you? Let me know at EAA182MEMPHIS@gmail.com and mark the subject ADS-B.

April Meeting Minutes

The April meeting was held at the CAF hangar at DeWitt Spain Airport on April 13, 2019 at 9:30a.m.

Chapter President Gerhard Schubert welcomed everyone. There were approximately 40 people in attendance, including members of the Memphis 99s.

Gerhard introduced our guest speaker, Commander Kendra Bowers, USN, whose presentation included how she became interested in aviation and her achievements in her career as a female Navy Pilot. Commander Bowers comes from a family of aviators and is a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy. She was the first female pilot to drop bombs in combat, flying an F-18 launched from the USS Enterprise in the Persian Gulf, earning her the Navy Commendation Medal with "V" device for valor in the line of duty. Commander Bowers spoke about flying several reconnaissance missions over Iraq airspace prior to the official mission and also talked about experiences taking off and landing on carriers as well as about successfully dodging and enemy surface-to-air missile and having a close call with an emergency refueling situation. All of the close calls she presented were as though it was "just normal" flight activity. Her presentation was well received and she now has several offers of flights to get her back in a plane!

The next order of business was to introduce the schedule for the upcoming EAA B-17 event to be held at Millington-Memphis Airport from May 30th to June 2nd. a list for volunteer sign up was available, and while there were some sign ups, we still need volunteers. The minimum number of volunteers needed per day is 5.

The Airport Manager at Millington-Memphis, Roy Remington, and Operations Manager, Alicia McCraw, will take care of public relations activities since they have excellent contacts with the media. They also own advertising spots with a 30-second B-17 clip that was provided by EAA headquarters tour management.

We will use the apron in front of CTI to make short taxiing distances possible. Fuel for the B-17 is being provided by CTI.

Vice President Gary Maidment reminded attendees about the activities for the "Memphis in May" Airshow where volunteers are needed to help the CAF Squadron with ground support.

Gary also reported about the successful fly out and announced that the next fly out will be on April 27th to Dexter, Missouri (KDXE).

The meeting was adjourned at 11a.m. The May meeting will be held on the 11th, location TBD.
