face to face once again!









New Admin Building Proposed


Air field owner Don McPherson, and architect Mike Smith, of Signature Architects, worked over the winter to create schematic designs for a proposed new administration building to replace the undersized and aging building that held Nancy's Air Field Restaurant and the Operations Office. The goal is to present the designs to the MassDOT- Aeronautics Division for consideration of funding. The available area for the new building is severely limited by various site and subsurface constraints, and even after adding basement storage and moving the airport manager's office to the second floor, an annex has been planned to accommodate the entire program of sorely needed spaces. The main building will contain not only a new restaurant space and operations office, but also larger and handicap accessible restrooms, a multi-function meeting room, a flight operations office, a test and debrief room, and plenty of basement storage . The Annex will contain areas for staff training and break room, pilot quiet room, showers, WX briefing and storage space for our mobile airport maintenance equipment. The annex is planned for the inside corner of our access road.






