FLIGHT TEST MANUAL

If you have completed your airplane project and are preparing to make the first flight, and subsequent test flights, you really need to get the new EAA Flight Test Manual. The EAA is <u>accepting orders</u>; the member price is \$17.95 and \$22.95 for nonmembers. Order now and the shipping is free. The new revised EAA Flight Test Manual is a comprehensive program for test flying your new experimental airplane. Unique to the EAA's system are test cards that take you through each test flight point-by-point and allow for easy data collection.

Builders who use the EAA Flight Test Manual will complete the program with a thoroughly tested aircraft, a full understanding of their craft's performance, characteristics, and limitations, and have enough date to easily build a comprehensive operating handbook for the airplane.

THINGS TO DO - PLACES TO FLY FOR BREAKFAST

The January meeting of the Falcons was an in person meeting at the CAU hangar. President Don Croyle brought the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. There were 37 members/guests present.

Don reminded everyone that there are 180 days to Oshkosh 2024. Gary C. reminded everyone that this is "builders week" and the EAA has lots of webinars to watch. A motion was made to accept the proposed change in dues. The motion was approved by members present.

Don asked for a motion to approve the November 2023 meeting minutes as published in the January 2024 Newsletter. The motion was made and approved.

Next Don introduced Jessica from Falcon Field admin to give us an update on Falcon news. Jessica is replacing DeeAnn who has a new position as an Airport Manager overseeing business leases at Falcon. Jessica is a native Arizonan and has been with the City of Mesa for 15 years, recently moving into DeeAnn's position. She is new to aviation but excited to learn more in her new role.

Falcon has decided to do smaller public events throughout the year as opposed to the annual open house. Look for the launch of a new airport web site which is coming at the end of February. Riley and Chaz are the latest staff members and will be doing maintenance. The Cockpit Close Up events have been very successful. There will be a Eurocoptor on February 3rd and the Easter Bunny will be there on March 23rd so bring the young kids out from 8-10 AM.

The storm damage recovery is continuing with work to restore the WWII hangars a priority. Structural repairs and re-roofing is completed. All repairs to these heavily damaged buildings should be done by the end of March. Work on hangars has started and about 1/3 of the damaged hangars have been repaired.

Copperstate is looking at the first week of November. They are working to bring the event back to Casa Grande.

Don reviewed the 14 accidents and incidents from December to mid January. Among them were gear up landings, tail strikes, loss of control and loss of a door and cowling. There were two in flight accidents resulting in 2 fatalities. There was also a balloon accident near Eloy that had 4 fatalities and one critically injured. Please be careful out there.

Tonight's guest speaker is Pharns Genece, the CEO and founder of Unmanned Systems Operations Group (USOG), a company specializing in logistics solutions through unmanned systems and secure drone delivery missions. Genece's career began in the US Air Force where he served as a flight nurse with a Medivac team for 18 years. After the Air Force, he worked as an Audio Engineer and Technical Lead at The Walt Disney Company in Anaheim, CA but later developed an interest in Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs). He holds an FAA Part 107 Remote Pilot certification, is a TOP Certified Pilot and a member of the FAA Safety Team (FAAST) serving on the Comp TIA Drone Advisory Board and the Commercial UAV (CUAV) advisory board. Pharns saw the potential for secure drone delivery of time sensitive materials, especially in the medical field, and that led to the creation of USOG.

Pharns discussed some of the FAA constraints on commercial drones: maximum weight is 55 lbs (including payload), you can only fly up to 400 feet agl (or 400 feet above a tall building if you launching from there), you can have ADS-B in but not out and need special authorization to fly out of visual range or in class B, C or D airspace. The FAA is also expected to require remote ID of drones in the near future.

Pharns brought several commercial and a customized drone and discussed their capabilities ranging from photo recon, crime scene mapping, search and rescue, and secure package delivery. USOG has the technical capability, in both design and fabrication, to customize drones for specific missions.

Thank you Pharns for a very interesting program.

The next meeting will be on February 22, 2024. The meeting adjourned at 8:45 PM.
