FLIGHT TEST MANUAL

If you have completed your airplane project and are preparing to make the first flight, and subsequent test flights, you really need to get the new EAA Flight Test Manual. The EAA is <u>accepting orders</u>; the member price is \$17.95 and \$22.95 for nonmembers. Order now and the shipping is free. The new revised EAA Flight Test Manual is a comprehensive program for test flying your new experimental airplane. Unique to the EAA's system are test cards that take you through each test flight point-by-point and allow for easy data collection.

Builders who use the EAA Flight Test Manual will complete the program with a thoroughly tested aircraft, a full understanding of their craft's performance, characteristics, and limitations, and have enough date to easily build a comprehensive operating handbook for the airplane.



Don reminded everyone that there are 256 days to Oshkosh 2024. Congrats to chapter members Sherry and Tim Niederkorn who were featured in Sport Aviation for their volunteer work at Oshkosh AirVenture.

The Christmas party will be held at the On the Green Sports bar on December 12 from 6:30 PM to 9 PM. Each member will get two free drink tickets. Food is available for purchase and Todd B. will be there to entertain us. We thank the DeAnne for all her efforts to allow the chapter to use the admin lobby for our holiday party.

Don asked for a motion to approve the September meeting minutes as published in the October Newsletter. The motion was made and approved.

Bill Worger summarized the YE activities. No individual flights recently. Let Mike E. know if you can do one off

flights. The EVIT YE event was completed with 10 airplanes flying 30 kids. For many, this was their first flight in a small plane. The YE credits used to buy a printer and scanner will help streamline the process. The next YE event will most likely be in March. Also, in June will be the aviation camp event. Member Ray T. had a successful youth flight in Alberta in memory of a pilot friend who passed away. Having helped with our YE events, Ray applied the same format for his event.

Andy Elliott gave a safety talk on avoiding stall/spin accidents. Because most of these occur in the pattern at low altitudes, they are often a fatal accident. He began with a few videos of accidents.

Stall/spin is almost always a pilot error. All modern airplanes are designed to be spin resistant. Even home built aircraft like the RV series will recover from a spin if you let go of the controls and you have sufficient altitude for recovery.

Andy's opinion is that most pilots don't have adequate training to understand how a plane gets into a stall spin situation. The FAA doesn't require any spin training. Even CFI candidates are not required to demonstrate a spin, only to initiate an immediate recovery before the spin develops. Years ago, slow flight training was conducted just above the stall speed often with the stall warning horn blaring. Today, they teach slow flight at a safe margin above the stall speed.

Andy showed an Air Force training video on stall-spins from 1943. At that time, as many pilots died in training as were KIA. The Air Force recognized the need for stall-spin training and changed their training to reduce these accidents.

In GA, 90% of stall-spin accidents occur in the pattern where the speed is low. Remember that as bank angle increases, the stall speed increases. Also, as g load increases, the stall speed increases. In the pattern, keep your turns shallow and you're airspeed safely above the stall speed. Get with your instructor and practice stall recovery and incipient stall-spins.
