EAA Chapter 228 Falcons Membership Meeting Minutes Summary February 22, 2022

The February meeting of the Falcons was an in person meeting at the CAF hangar. President Don Croyle brought the meeting to order at 7:05 PM. There were 40 members/guests present.

Don opened the meeting with a a reminder that AirVenture 2022 is only 148 days away. Don asked how many would be interested in a chapter 228 camp site. More than three people were interested so Don will proceed with making plans for that to happen. He then asked for a progress report from Jayden, our Ray Scholar. Jayden is looking for a new instructor and is ready to take the written test. The 2022 EAA calendars are here. If you ordered one, they are \$15 each. If you joined recently and have not gotten a name tag, see Leslie. Applications are being accepted for the EAA Aviation Camp in Oshkosh. Don continued by asking for a motion to approve the January meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. The motion was made and passed.

Next Don asked guests/visitors to introduce themselves.

Tim R. recently retired and will be moving here from Denver. He is interested in joining our Chapter.

Steve H. is a snowbird from Denver. He flies an RV-8.

Van T. belongs to the Colorado Springs chapter and is just visiting. He restored a Super Chipmunk.

Gary H. is building a Kitfox and has a 1939 Taylor Craft.

Nathan B. is from Gilbert and is here to support his son Zach with achieving his aviation career goals.

Larry M. is in the process of relocating from Fargo, ND to Arizona. He is working here at Falcon doing aircraft financing. He has built a gyrocopter.

Next was an update on Falcon Field by Dee Anne.

Pavement resealing around the hangars is proceeding in stages. Regarding filling large cracks, Brent S. has worked with the contractors on this issue and they will be filling large cracks before resurfacing.

Last week there was a dedication ceremony of WWII murals project on McDowell Rd underpass. Materials for the viewing area outside the terminal area are here and the work has started. The west ramp repaving project is on going. Funds for the east ramp reconstruction have been received. This work will start in early 2023.

Don did not have any inputs to update members build projects. Todd B. did say that Lewis M. has

moved his RV-8 to Chandler and is close to finishing.

Social dinners at Vito's (4:00 PM) on the second Saturday have resumed. Thursday coffee at 7:30 to 9:00 AM in the the newly revamped Warbirds ready room. Come check it out.

Next Trent H. covered Navigation Challenge on February 26-27th. Without using GPS, participants flying in two person teams will have to locate and photograph land marks using bearing/distance information and a map. There will be prizes awarded and a BBQ at the Falcon Filed picnic grounds at 2 PM on February 27th. We hope to have this become an annual event. Also in the planning stage with the APA is an Arizona Passport program. The program encourages pilots to fly to the 56 public use airports and visit the 9 museum, and 12 restaurants associated with these airports. Proof of completion is by scanning a QR code. This program must be sanctioned by the Arizona Department of Tourism. There will be prizes at various levels of completion. Similar programs have been implemented in about six other states. Don gave the airspace and accident news.

Pilot deviations continue to be an issue. These were committed by all class of pilots from students to ATPs. Make sure you understand ATC instructions and be aware of the airspace you are in.

There were 2 accidents since the last report. One was at Kingman and another involved a jet. Please be careful out there.

Bill Worger gave a YE report. Last month pilots flew 8 YE's. The next YE event planned will be on March 26, 2022 at Falcon Field. We have 40 kids and 10 on the wait list. Bill needs at least 3 more pilots. Let him know if you can help. Upcoming

events are aviation summer camp kids on June 4th and an EVIT group at Pegasus on October 29th.

There is also going to be a STEM + C event on April 9th in Gilbert. Gary C. will have his flight sim there and if you have something else to demo see Bill. They expect several hundred kids to attend. Volunteers in 2 hr slots are needed.

Next Andy Elliott gave a safety brief on Bravo airspace and unusual clearances. You need three things to fly into Class B airspace: a transponder, two way radio communication and a "Cleared to enter Class B" clearance from ATC. Andy recapped a recent experience he had in the Phoenix Bravo airspace. Returning from California on super bowl Sunday, Andy received a squark code and clearance into Bravo around the Deer Valley airport. Flying east at about 5500 feet, he was cleared to descend to 4000 ft. Between Deer Valley and Scottsdale airport he was told "keep your squawk, cleared direct to Falcon Field, contact Falcon tower". Falcon tower gave him a left base for 4 R. Since his flight path would bring him back into class B, the question is, is he cleared to reenter the class B airspace?

The answer is yes. He never was told "radar services terminated, squawk VFR, so he was still under ATC control. If he had been, he could not reenter Bravo airspace.

NOTE: if you are using flight following and your flight path is going to put you into Class B airspace, it is always a good idea to verify you are cleared into Bravo airspace.

Andy announced that on the first weekend in March, the Warbirds will be hosting a formation clinic. If you are in the qui to depart and you see a bunch of warbirds ready to launch, tell the tower you will let them depart first.

Thank you Andy.

The next meeting will be on March 22, 2022. Don closed with a reminder to keep current by learning.

The meeting adjourned at 8:37 PM.

PILOT DEVIATIONS

The number of pilot deviations that have been reported by the FAA SDL FSDO is up from last month. These latest deviations were again committed by the full range of pilot certificate holders. It seems that some pilots just don't seem to understand what type of airspace they are flying in, or are about to enter into, and what is going to be expected of them. This problem is evident each month by the number, and type of pilot deviations that are being committed. In this past one month reporting period, there were 26 general aviation pilot deviations recorded, and of the twenty-six deviations made, there was a need to issue nine notices that further FAA action would be needed. Please use care when flying, and don't be part of the problem by committing a deviation. See the latest APA Newsletter for all the details.
