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BAD NOTAM Task Force

Aviation prides itself on safety. There is a glaring gap.

Every day, every airline flight in the world: Pilots are forced to use a broken, archaic briefing system from the 1920's, and as a result, they regularly miss critical flight information.

What would have been the single worst disaster in aviation history -Air Canada 759, in July 2017 – was averted by only 1 second!

The cause: this flawed briefing system, meaning the pilots did not realize their runway was closed.


The briefing system, or Notices to Airmen (NOTAM) is a worldwide standard, and presents information in a coded, upper case, incredibly un-human-friendly format, is overloaded with irrelevant information, and

creates 100 page briefing packages for flight crews that are simply impossible to read and understand.

For every pilot and passenger alike, this creates unacceptable risk.

What's the problem?

COUNT: The huge number of NOTAMs in the briefing package, making it way too difficult to find the critical element that could lead to dis-

More Soldiers Killed igniting an Army Aviation Stand Down

On April 28, 2023, The chief of staff of the US Army grounded all Army aviators not involved in critical missions following another fatal midair collision just weeks after 9 soldiers were killed when two HH-60 Black Hawk helicopters crashed during training.

Active-duty units are required to complete a 24-hour stand-down between May 1st and 5th, and the Army National Guard and reserve will have until May 31. During the stand-down, the Army will review the risk approval/risk management process, aviation maintenance training program, aircrew training standardization and management, and supervisory responsibility. The Army will also assess the flight-mission briefing process with an emphasis on risk mitigation, crew selection, flight planning, crew/flight briefings, debriefings and after-action reviews.

The stand-down grounds all Army aviators, except for those participating in critical missions, until the required training is completed and after any corrective actions are taken.

Last month, three soldiers were killed and one injured when two Apache attack helicopters collided as they were returning from a training mission near Fort Wainwright, Alaska.

In March, <u>nine solders were killed</u> during a routine night training flight near Fort Campbell, Kentucky, when their Black Hawk helicopters collided.

In February, a Black Hawk military helicopter crashed near Highway 53 in Huntsville, Alabama, killing all on board.

CAPITALS: The telegraphic format issue, specifically, "everything is printed in caps and hard to read.

CODING: Coding and abbreviations, and most pilots don't know them all. You can take any message and make it unclear with those two things, caps and coding.

CRAP: Lots of junk Notams: grass cutting, birds, fireworks, foxes on the airport — all useless information to the pilot. There are a lot of animals in the NOTAMs and nothing you can do about it in your airplane.

CONTROL: We have to rely on a single source – the State. As shown in MH17, this not reliable – and there are scores of other examples of states not telling the full story.

In 2018, Robert Sumwalt, then the board chair of the U.S. National Transportation Safety Board, said that NOTAMs had become "just a bunch of garbage that nobody pays any attention to."

That year, Congress passed a bill requiring the FAA to reform the NOTAM system, including by creating a machine which would establish a -readable interface to give pilots and other flight professionals the option to streamline their delivery.

That process, which is still ongoing, requires multiple ware programs to communicate with each other.

Earlier this year, The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) grounded all flights resulting in airlines canceling more than 1,300 flights, and delaying nearly 10,000 more, according to flight tracker FlightAware.com. The FAA blamed an unspecified failure in the Notice to Airman (NOTAM) system.

Regardless of the cause of the formation in the format failure, the NOTAM system has long been a source of

frustration for pilots and others in the aviation industry who say it overloads them with information that's irrelevant to their flight and makes it difficult to identify actually useful information.

The Senate has advanced the Notam Improvement Act of 2023, task force to recommend improvements to the notam system.

Senate passage by unanimous consent last week follows House approval in late January.

However, the Senate-passed bill includes amendments to require the FAA to complete its implementation of the new, modernized Federal Notam System and have a backup system in place by Sept. 30, 2024, and to call on the FAA to brief Congress on a plan to improve the ability of the notam system to offer machinereadable and filterable inused by the International Civil Aviation Organization. EAA Air Venture Oshkosh 2023 Notice Includes Important Procedure Updates

There are several important FAA-approved changes in the EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Notice (commonly referred to as the Oshkosh NOTAM), featuring arrival and departure procedures for EAA's 70th flyin convention on July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh. These changes are based on pilot feedback and FAA

"The most essential information for any pilot flying to Oshkosh involves reading and thoroughly understanding the 2023 AirVenture Notice to ensure safe operations on arrival and departure," said Sean Elliott, EAA's vice president of advocacy and safety. "This FAA Notice docu-



ment states the official requirements and expectations for pilots. We also urge all pilots to log appropriate crosscountry time prior to their trip to Oshkosh so they have the proficiency and confidence to fly safely." Changes for 2023 Fond du Lac Diversion Proc This notice does not supersede NOTAMs

The document is in effect from noon CDT on Thursday, July 20, until noon CDT on Monday, July 31, and outlines procedures for the many types of aircraft that fly to Oshkosh for the event. as well as aircraft that land at nearby airports.

The Notice was designed by the FAA to assist pilots in their EAA AirVenture flight planning. It is now known as the

Oshkosh Notice instead of a NOTAM because of a changed FAA internal procedure.

Arrival/Departure

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Some of the 2023 changes include:

- A change in the AirVenture ultralight pattern at Wittman Regional Airport.
- Guidance regarding Oshkosh aircraft parking areas, including North 40/South 40

through noon CDT on Monday, July 31.

The ATC-assignable transition points approaching Oshkosh from the west that will ease holding and congestion will again be in effect in 2023. These points are at Endeavor Bridge, Puckaway Lake, and Green Lake. They will be announced on the arrival ATIS when ATC activates them at times of highest traffic flows.




