New Aviation Store at Carp

I have received the following news item from one of our local flyers. Chad Wilton will lease the Roots hangar at the west end of the Carp Airport and he plans to set up a store with aviation products. Contact Chad if you have any suggestions (ed).

The basic premise for this store is very simple in that we need an aviation supply store to service the national capital region. Our options currently for aviation products are either mail order or online sales through VIP or Aviation world. As a retailer myself these two options frustrate me. When I want to purchase product I would like to be able to touch and see what I'm buying to make sure its actually what I want. That option is completed erased when ordering product online. I also find myself hoping

the product is what I think it was based on the picture which is not always the case.

Therefore I decided to do something about it. I am going to open a 1500 square foot fly in/drive in retail store on the carp field. I intend to carry a complete range of aviation supplies from handheld gps' to charts to fuel testers. I also would like to have input from local pilots as to common breakdown parts that they would like to see stocked in the store. We have no intention of being a repair facility however if we can stock some parts and allow pilots to get back in the air quicker I'm all for it.

My intention is to create a place that pilots would want to shop as well as a place non pilots could come to purchase gifts

and so on for the pilots in their lives. I hope to have the store open by late August or early September but that will depend on how quickly we can get the hanger re fit for a retail store. At this time I hope to be open 7 days a week giving people ample opportunity to purchase what they need when they need it.
