Quite surprisingly we did have a good turn out by car and foot so interest is there come rain or shine.

Unfortunately the bad weather hit Canada Day making for a poor turnout at Rockcliffe Flying Club's breakfast. John Montgomery put on a great show for the kids at the Canada Aviation and Space Museum for Canada day. John was supported by EAA chapter members and members of his Air Cadet's Squadron.

With many of our members traveling to Oshkosh the third Saturday falls on many member's departure day and we anticipate a thin turn out. I will not be attending Oshkosh this year but will be hosting our chapter meeting at my hangar at Smiths Falls (Hangar 16 on Taxiway B. This is the last reminder I am giving. You should all have updated your VNC charts either paper or electronic to cover the Ottawa area. Remember there have been significant changes in place since May 1st so if you are using old charts please get rid of them or be prepared for an unpleasant phone call from Transport Canada. If you are using EFIS or electronic charts please make sure you are up to date. In my previous messages I had indicated Carp Airport would be providing MOGAS to those that needed it. Unfortunately Mark Braithwaite has been unsuccessful in finding a supplier of the fuel as the vendors are nervous about liability arising from possible contamination from ethanol. This comes about as the same fuel tankers are used for both fuels.

There has been little progress on the deck or the roof but we hope now to be doing some work on this in the fall when the temperature comes down. Please be prepared to support your chapter by helping out once the date for the repair has been set.

We have seen a couple of aircraft using the chapter hangar over the past few weeks for inspections and maintenance. Remember all full members are entitled to use the hangar at no cost for all your maintenance. I would like to encourage people to do this as it also provides the opportunity for other members to view aircraft from a different perspective. Please take advantage of this great facility but make sure you arrange it with John Montgomery (Operations Manager) as a conflict of usage can be very disappointing. Remember you are required to be a full member in good standing to use the hangar and the tools within the workshop.
