Hackman spent 20 years in regulatory affairs and aviation services at the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, including five years as vice president of regulatory affairs. In that role, he provided oversight and vision for regulatory initiatives across a number of federal agencies. Hackman also led advocacy across a range of aviation issues involving airman and aircraft certification, medical policy, environmental issues, aircraft maintenance, and more. As part of his previous AOPA work, Hackman participated in countless rulemaking and advisory groups, including the General Aviation Joint Steering Committee, Aviation Rulemaking and Advisory Committee, Unleaded Avgas Transition Aviation Rulemaking Committee, and Part 23 Reorganization Aviation Rulemaking Committee. He also holds commercial and airline transport pilot certificates and flight instructor ratings for single and multiengine aircraft, including instrument training.

This event is an opportunity for a new person to jump in with both feet and learn a lot about the wonderful world of homebuilding. We will cover areas like getting started successfully and techniques when building with sheet metal, composites, steel, and wood. But it won't be just for the newbie; we are offering in-depth talks on panel planning, engine selection, FAA certification, flight testing, and selling a homebuilt aircraft. There will be something for every builder, whether you are just starting out, knee deep in a project, or just received your airworthiness certificate — it is going to be a great learning opportunity.

EAA is working with industry experts, kit manufacturers, and other subject matter experts to provide top-notch material for builders. The sessions will be live and allow time for attendee questions. Recordings will be archived and available to EAA members for review.

Member Profile: John Forster

Ask what got Chapter 252's new Vice President interested in aviation, and he answers without hesitation: "July 20, 1969!"

John likes to joke that "I didn't get too far in my life"—he was born in Kaukauna and still lives there along with his wife Carrie who recently stepped down as chapter president after serving in that capacity for four years.

After high school John went to the Milwaukee School of Engineering where he studied electrical engineering. John returned to Kaukauna a year after graduating to take a position with Baisch Engineering and stayed with the company for 36 years before retiring! responsibilities beckoned, the manufacturen shut down, and John realized that a smaller, simpler homebuilt would be more practical. He sold the TR-4 and, along with daugh-

John grew up in the time of the Space Race and had space models, Major Matt Mason, and books. (John and your newsletter editor got sidetracked while preparing for this article discussing Major Matt Mason toys.) John, like millions of other kids, dreamed of becoming an astronaut. He later considered opportunities with the US Naval Academy to possibly fly jets, but ultimately went to college and started a family and career before circling back to aviation. "I always had the bug and the interest; I just didn't have the time."

By 1995 John had attended AirVenture and decided it was time to learn to fly. He went to Max Air in Appleton and began lessons. After getting his license, it wasn't easy keeping current. Joining the Winnebago Flying Club brought consistency. "Then my darling wife made the mistake of saying 'Hey maybe we should get our own airplane!' Then when she started learning to fly, that was the big thing." They bought a Piper Archer which over time they've upgraded with a new engine and a new panel. With both John and Carrie now retired, they plan to fly more than in the past, and John is working on an instrument rating.

It's no surprise that John became interested in homebuilding given his proximity to Oshkosh, and not long after earning his license he bought a kit for a KIS TR-4 Cruiser. The four-place airplane was a new design from a new company. After making some progress on the kit, other responsibilities beckoned, the manufacturer shut down, and John simpler homebuilt would be more practical. He sold the TR-4 and, along with daughter Jessica, bought Sonex kits. Jessica now has a young family of her own, but with her dad now retired plans are being formulated to combine both their kits and a B model upgrade and complete an airplane.

The Forster Archer got a hangar mate a few years ago—a Citabria, which Jessica flies. John enjoys family flying outings, even if it means that he only gets to fly a third of the time.

John is also working on another flying machine... since retiring he has gotten back to his roots and rediscovered model rocketry. He always wanted an Estes Saturn V model rocket

kit, and now he has one. Liftoff is expected later this year.

John has given back to aviation though Chapter 252 for many years, where his new position of Vice President is just his latest officer position. John has been our Young Eagles Coordinator



(with Carrie) and is also (again with Carrie) a leader in the chapter RV-12 teen build program. In spite of his employer's best efforts to keep him from retiring and enduring several call-backs, John is now free, and we expect to see him at the chapter even more in 2023.
