

Old Business:

Welcome Board Member: Eric Abraham

Eric agreed to fill vacant board position for the rest of the year.

Teen RV-12 Build

Cancelled Wed. 8/24 session due to Carrie and John being sick at the time. Rescheduled to the following week.

Talking with Kyle Voltz for help reorganizing the chapter hangar.

RV-12 kit delivered to hangar. Still need written agreement from EAA for transfer of kit, but we can start building kit.

Inherited 3 work benches from 2022 One Week Wonder.

Chapter Hangar

Dent on the east side of the hangar has been repaired, thanks to Doug's work.

Need to figure out where to set up the benches for RV-12 build.

Someone's seaplane currently stored in chapter hangar since AirVenture for an engine swap.

Ethan Beswick finding a different hangar to store his Maule.

Kyle Voltz suggested setting up a hangar committee, instead of just having one hangar manager, to make decisions about the chapter hangar.

Hangar committee would have 3-5 people to spearhead decision-making, plus volunteers to help with particular tasks.

Opportunity to get more chapter members involved, instead of just relying on the existing board of directors.

Board members in attendance favorable to setting up a hangar committee.

May buy some additional shelving for storing things in hangar. Would help with storing and organizing items for pancake breakfasts and the RV-12 build. Will need to establishing budget for shelving.

Jim Casper willing to help organize. Has tools to donate and some plastic shelves that can be donated in the spring (support 150 lbs per shelf).

Watch out for sales on shelving, e.g. from Menard's.

Should a seating area be set up to make the hangar more welcoming, and to facilitate people hanging out outside of official chapter gatherings?

Hangar layout should still provide the ability to store an airplane, since storing airplanes generates revenue for the chapter. Room for one plane would be sufficient. Some stages of the build project may require reorganizing the hangar and could temporarily eliminate room for storing plane(s).

Two EAA flight simulators are still at the chapter hangar. Could be a resource for members to use.

Ray Aviation Scholarship

Ike Langkau

Had his first solo flight (congratulations!). Solo progress report submitted to EAA. Second scholarship payout of \$4,000 on the way.

Forrest Drews

Has 35 hours of flight time and is almost ready for the written exam.

Interested in pursuing A&P. Carrie and John Forster and CFI John Dorcey are talking about benefits of being both a pilot and an A&P.

Jarrett Schiedemeyer

Passed the written exam before AirVenture. Second scholarship payout of \$2,000 on the way.

Just started college at Lewis University in Illinois, in their aviation program. Chapter is working with him to determine the future of his flight training under the Ray Scholarship.

Chapter starting a small study group for FAA written exam with Ray Scholars and other youth members.

Chris mentioned that Sporty's has a free FAA written exam preparation resource on its website. Could be beneficial for student pilots without access to the Sporty's Learn to Fly Course.
