



Pilot Requirements

The Young Eagles pilot requirements are basic, but **MUST** be followed.

- > Be a current EAA® member and hold an appropriate airman's certificate (sport pilot or greater)
- > Possess a current medical certificate (if applicable)
- > Be current to carry passengers in the aircraft you plan to use
- > Have a current flight review
- > Complete the Young Eagles registration form before the flight, including parent or legal guardian signature, and pilot signature
- > Conduct flights in an aircraft that is in airworthy condition
- Have aircraft passenger liability insurance for the aircraft used (owned, rented, or borrowed)

Adhere to all Federal Aviation Requirements (FARs)

> Complete both the online training and basic background check as a part of EAA's Youth Protection Policy. For more information, visit EAA.org/YouthProtection.

The IMC Club's purpose is to promote instrument flying, proficiency, and safety. The intent is to create a community of pilots willing to share information, provide recognition, foster communications, promote safety, and build proficiency in instrument flying. All chapter members who are interested in improving their flying skills, whether they are VFR or IFR rated are welcome to attend.



The IMC Club has been meeting consistently on the second Monday of the month at 6:00pm at Bult Field with strong interest and attendance. The meeting format has standardized on monthly question(s), discussion scenario involving weather, mechanical, or some other abstract unforeseen event, and then some IFR learning based on a topic recommended by attendees.

Topics to date included discussion scenarios such as "Can you hear me Now?", "Propsicle", and "Other kind of Alternate" where situations presented themselves and the group had to consider alternatives and come up with the safest and best outcome given the constraints contained in the scenario definition.

IFR learning topics to date included flying SID / STAR procedures, NOS vs Jeppesen Approach plates, Lost Communications, IFR Best Practices / Acronyms / Tips & Tricks, Holding Patterns, and DME Arcs.

With the diverse level of experience amongst attendees - there have been shared stories of real-life emergencies, weather related events, and IFR flying experiences contributed and added value to the discussion topic at hand while providing insight as to how impactful IFR challenges or hazards can be.

Due to the Easter holiday, the April meeting will be held on <u>Thursday April 13, 2023</u>. The agenda is being finalized and will be sent via email and updated on the Chapter Facebook page when available. JOE'S BUILDER'S CORNER

Joe's project update:

The top skins of both wings are complete. Chapter 260 member <u>Ed Punjak</u> has been helping a ton - I wouldn't be able to get the progress I've made without his assistance. It's nice starting to get some bigger pieces together! It's starting to look like real airplane parts. It's been about a year since I began the wing kit, and when I look at what has gotten completed, I wonder why it took so long – it looks like it should have taken a long weekend. But when reviewing the plans, there was a lot (A LOT) of preparation work to be completed before the parts were able to be assembled.

The wings are far from complete – the leading edges, fuel tanks, and all of the control surfaces still must be completed. This will take quite some time.

The fuselage kit should arrive in June, though I'm not nearly ready to begin that part of the kit. I will feel accomplished if I were to be able to start the fuselage by this time next year. While the kit will sit untouched, at least I'll have it ready to go when I complete the wings.

Changes to the Class C airspace around <u>Chicago</u> <u>Midway International Airport</u> will be

implemented starting June 15th. Expansion of the airspace will increase safety and efficiency, but the impacts to general aviation operations will be minimized because of AOPA's recommendations to the FAA.

The change was announced in a final rule <u>published on March 23</u>rd in the *Federal Register*. It extends the existing Class C airspace shelf to the east side of the airport, from the southeast counterclockwise to the northeast. <u>The most</u> <u>notable change for GA pilots is the expansion that</u> <u>will follow the Chicago lakefront.</u>

The purpose of modifying the airspace is to further separate arrivals to Chicago Midway's Runway 22L and GA aircraft flying VFR along the Lake Michigan shoreline. "The FAA is taking this action to reduce the risk of midair collisions and enhance the efficient management of air traffic operations in the MDW terminal area," the rule states.


Chicago Midway Class C Expansion Mitigated

AOPA was involved throughout the process of adjusting the proposed modifications to the existing Class C airspace surrounding Chicago Midway, first engaging in the issue as part of an ad hoc committee formed in 2020. The FAA agreed to multiple recommendations from AOPA, including an increase in the floor of the Class C over the water to 2,300 feet and changes in lateral boundaries of the outer shelf that utilize visual landmarks as reference points.

Most recently, AOPA—citing wake turbulence and traffic separation concerns—negotiated a change to the airspace modification that requires aircraft flying the visual approach to Runway 22L to remain at or above 3,000 feet until crossing the shoreline.

"Not only will this provide additional separation from VFR aircraft operating in the lakefront corridor, but it will also provide consistency with the other IFR approaches to Runway 22L," said AOPA Director of Airspace, Air Traffic, and Security Jim McClay in the <u>December 19 letter</u> to the FAA.

Pilots flying along the Chicago lakefront, or in or around Chicago Midway International Airport, should familiarize themselves with the coming changes, as they are significant. Additionally, with EAA AirVenture Oshkosh—the world's busiest aviation event—hosted shortly after the charts are updated, pilots flying to and from the event in Wisconsin should be aware of the new dimensions of the Class C.
