



FRED BOOS FIRST EAA 260 CHAPTER PRESIDENT

EAA Chapter 260 was initially formed in 1966 in Dolton, Illinois at the home of <u>Fred Boos</u>. Our Chapter has come a long way over the years to its present form.

JOE'S BUILDER'S CORNER

Chapter Member (and newly elected Director) <u>Joe Cirelli</u> has been building a Van's RV-14A. Joe's build progress has been featured in some of the past Chapter newsletter. Here is his latest update.

The RV-14A build has been progressing, albeit a little slower than I'd care for. While I spend many hours each week in the hangar or at the airport, most of that time has been spent organizing, socializing, and enjoying my time with our fellow aviators. I've been spending about eight hours a week on actually building the airplane, giving me a pace of about a six-year build. My initial goal was to be complete in about five years.

The horizontal stabilizer was completed at the end of August, with the elevators beginning in early September. I'm about 85% complete with the elevators and anticipate finishing them up in the next couple of weeks. Through the process of assembling the elevators and elevator trim tab, I've learned to work with ProSeal sealant, learned additional riveting and bucking techniques, and formed some simple bends in the skin.

In December I moved hangars once again from C1 to E17. This should be my final move. The new location provides closer access to the runway, a feature not needed for many years, but it is desirable during the warmer months. I spend a lot of time at the airport for leisure, where I enjoy relaxing and watching the planes come and go.

I'm at the hangar most Wednesday evenings and most weekends; there's usually food and beverages; feel free to stop by at any time.

UPCOMING APRIL 16th CHAPTER PROGRAM

Guest Speaker - Commander Kirk Lippold, USN (Ret.)

Commander Kirk Lippold, USN (Ret.) was the Commanding Officer of the USS Cole when it came under a suicide terrorist attack by al Qaeda in the port of Aden, Yemen. He and his crew distinguished themselves by saving the ship from sinking. This event is widely recognized as one of the most brazen acts of terrorism by al-Qaeda prior to September 11, 2001.



Kirk is a Private Instrument rated pilot and a Beechcraft Bonanza aircraft owner. He is a member of several aviation organizations including EAA, AOPA, and ABS. He regularly attends & speaks at EAA events including Sun N Fun and AirVenture.

Today, Commander Lippold is a popular inspirational figure and leadership speaker who remains in high demand among Fortune 500 companies, industry associations, and regularly appears on major cable news programs to bring thoughtful and common sense analysis on national security issues and world events.

He is a 1981 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy experiencing a distinguished career serving in a variety of challenging positions. His assignments, to several different types of ships in the Navy, including a tank landing ship, as well as several Aegis guided missile cruisers and destroyers, all which expanded his scope of responsibility and leadership opportunities. Operating ships at sea is a hazardous business. These activities present unique challenges that necessitate quick thinking and split-second decisions to deal with potentially dangerous situations.

Training and preparation <u>define readiness</u>. Leadership will determine whether any organization will survive. While preparing for each deployment, he developed the rigorous mindset necessary to sail into harm's way. Each deployment was unique and supported U.S. military forces engaged in peacetime and combat operations. These experiences sharpened his leadership skills while also improving his ability to deal with any crisis. Again, through those challenges, he demonstrated repeatedly that leadership matters.

On October 12, 2000, all these skills came into sharp focus during the attack on USS *Cole*. Like any crisis, it was unexpected. What that moment did was define why day-to-day leadership and crisis management skills are important. Kirk has authored a book called *Front Burner* that details the bombing of the USS *Cole* and the aftermath.

He will be attending Chapter 260's monthly meeting at Bult Field on Saturday, April 16, 2022 to present his patriotic and inspirational - Decision Making in a Crisis - presentation after the chapter meeting. The presentation will detail how the terrorist attack on the USS Cole shaped his approach to aviation and how pilots can react to the unexpected.
