Safety Tip of the Month

Fall and winter bring on special challenges due to cool/cold weather operations.

Fall mornings check for frost on lifting surfaces; it can affect performance and stall characteristics. If water seeps down into linkages, landing gear doors, pitot tubes, radio masts etc. it can freeze thus rendering some or all of the effectiveness to diminish or not work at all.

Check proper inflation of tires, and oleo struts. Nitrogen is preferred over air as it does not have any water and will not cause rust.

In winter try to use a pre heater, or at least a heat gun to warm the engine before start-up. If starting cold, do not over prime. That washes down the cylinders. Before run-up insure the minimum oil temp and pressure are attained. Exercise the prop until you see the oil pressure change, if so equipped. This may take more than three cycles.

If equipped with carb heat, ensure proper operation. Place the heat on full - never partial. Consult your P.O.H.

NEVER depart into either suspected or known icing; it's a killer!!

Always carry your cell phone along. If you are ever forced down, it may save your life.

Please Turn the Pump <u>OFF!!</u>

The constant pressure erodes the valves in the toilets until they leak. The resulting water then fills the holding tank, which costs \$275.00 to empty. When I was handed a temporary Pilot Certificate on January 21, 1977 little did I know what was in store for this high school senior. Living only a mile away from a major airport on the south side of Chicago (next to a guy named Leroy Brown) provided me with many beautiful glimpses of various airplanes cranking and banking, pilots jockeying their aero machines into position to land at this once busy airport, that is now busy again. It was quite fascinating to see all this happen under various clouds, weather, and windy conditions from my parent's house. The airline will begin to hire NEW pilots in the middle of November (sorry we are REALLY behind here and now that will start in January) so if you have an Airline Transport Pilot certificate and 1,500 hours, AA is looking for YOU! In fact all the airlines are looking for YOU!

And now with the new FAA "REST" rules kicking in on January 4, 2014, the airline needs 436 more pilots that DAY to run the new rest schedule and they have not hired anyone yet....ahhh hello! This all came about from the Buffalo, NY accident where the flight crew was up all night trying to get to their base to work their flights the next day. So the airlines are now required to schedule more rest hours behind the door in the hotel for crews. We as pilots are required to have 8 hours rest **BEFORE** our first flight of the trip.
