### Thursday Meeting Presenter, 7 PM @ SWI Terminal—Lt. Gen. John Campbell, USAF (Ret).




Lieutenant General John Campbell retired from the US Air Force in 2003 after a 32-year career. In his last military assignments, he served as Deputy Director for Operations, Joint Staff, the Pentagon; and Associate Director of Central Intelligence, Central Intelligence Agency, Langley VA.

Prior to his Washington assignments, he served around the world in a variety of operational assignments as an F-15 and F-16 fighter pilot and commander, including overseas assignments in Saudi Arabia, Iceland, Germany and Italy.

General Campbell is the recipient of numerous military and intelligence community awards, including the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Air Medal, the CIA Distinguished Service Award, the National Imagery and Mapping Agency Award, the National Reconnaissance Distinguished Service Medal, and the National Security Agency Award.

General Campbell serves on numerous boards and community organizations. He is a resident of McKinney, TX. He and his wife, Marky, have three children and five grandchildren and are members of the First United Methodist Church of McKinney.
