Presentation: Art Bussy and Floyd Bennett Field in the 1930's

Jill shared a slide show of her grandfather, Arthur Bussy, the operator of United Air Service at Floyd Bennett Field on Long Island during the 1930's. Art encompassed much of what was going on in aviation in the 1930's....charter flights, rescue flights, mercy flights for medical issues, tours over New York City in his Ford trimotor, Miss Albany, and air racing, including a $2^{\rm nd}$ place finish in the 1939 Bendix Air Race. Art worked on routes to London , via one stop in New Foundland.

With the coming of WWII, Art transitioned to military work, ferrying PBY's from Honolulu to Manila, Philipines, working as a test pilot for Convair's bomber and later, after the war, continuing work as their test pilot for first flights on the early Convair "airliners". After an injury that brought on debilitating arthritis, Art helped to establish early airline routes in the U.S., with couriers delivering materials to his home for his work.

Many of the members at the gathering asked for a copy of the slide show to further look at the pictures and read some of the newspaper articles. A google link is shared here, if you're interested in checking it out. Note: The file is over 1 GB, so is a long, slow download!
