•	Dave Buyak (1965 C-172G) Side kick panels are complete and installed, rudder pedal covers were repaired, refurbished and reinstalled, interior panels are complete, and Dave is finishing out the headliner installation also with Airtex. Dave shared photos and a video of his work.
•	Doug Melville (Gliders and RV) The RV-6A has a new prop and he was able to fly the aircraft last Saturday. Doug also passed around the glider tail cone he built with Don from plans he shared at the last meeting. The tailcone is made from carbon fiber and epoxy. Eric Nulsen (RV-7)
