Featured Speaker: Richard Rozanski, D.A.R.

Rich Rozanski joined us in July to give a presentation on what a DAR is and what they do and how that impacts both aircraft owners and builders. A "DAR" is a Designated Airworthiness Representative, basically a Quality Assurance person, who can be part of the process of an aircraft being certified.

Rich explained that aircraft owners and builders can either go to the FAA or to a DAR who has been given that designation by the FAA but doesn't work for the FAA. A DAR does an airworthiness inspection after either an initial build (before flight test) or a major alteration. He is not an engineer nor is the role of a DAR to be an engineer, but rather to assure quality of the work performed in the interest of safety.

Rich also went on to explain some of the rule changes and real life scenarios that have taken place in his experience, which also included a stint with the FAA and, prior to that, with Sikorsky.

It was a great talk and Rich also fielded questions at the end of his talk. If you are interested in contacting him for more information or for booking him for DAR services, let Vince know as he has Rich's contact information.
