50 Years Ago in Aviation . . . October 1962

- October 14 A U.S. Air Force Lockheed U-2 reconnaissance flight over Cuba reveals the presence of launchpads for mediumrange ballistic missiles, triggering the Cuban Missile Crisis.
- October 23 In Operation Blue Moon, six U.S. Navy RF-8 Crusader photographic reconnaissance aircraft flying from Key West, Florida, conduct the first American low-level flights over Cuba, flying at 400 mph (644 km/hr) only a few hundred feet off the ground.^[22]
- October 24 The attack aircraft carriers USS Enterprise (CVA(N)-65) and USS Independence (CVA-62) and the antisubmarine carriers USS Essex (CVS-9) and USS Randolph (CVS-15) take part inblockading Cuba.
- October 26 The last B-52 Stratofortress off the production line is delivered to the U.S. Air Force.
