Chuck was well known in aviation and always had his finger on the pulse of aviation in Central Ohio and Licking County. Chuck and his sister Katrina grew up in an aviation family which even had a family airport, Snook Field, on the east side of Columbus at one time. Chuck's father, Buster Snook, and his uncle, Kelly Snook, were members of 402 before their passings and his uncle, John Shepard and aunt Tonya are members of 402 as well. The obituary for Chuck was in the Newark Advocate newspaper today, Wednesday, October 11th. The obit can be found online at the newspaper's website. Services will be held at Cotner Funeral Home, 7369 E. Main St., Reynoldsburg, Ohio. Visitation is from 11:00 am until noon with services to follow. Interment will be at Glen Rest Memorial Estate. The obituary says "contributions in his memory, if desired in lieu of flowers, may be given to his sister Katrina."

EAA 402 Minutes September 19, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Tony Rowell, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to The Flag. There were nineteen members present and one visitor, Andrew Bates of Boeing STEM.

Secretary's Report – There were no additions or corrections to the August minutes as published in the September newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Presented by Treasurer Scott Kennedy. Beginning balance was \$2252.65; Total Income \$1016.65; Utility Expenses \$84.71; Portable Toilet expense for YE, \$135.00. The ending balance was \$3049.59 including \$1798.85 in reserve funds. Discretionary funds: (Ending balance less reserves, loess debts, plus outstanding receipts) \$1250.74. Airport Board Report – Rollie Bailey: Last bills for the new FBO have been paid; The old FBO is yet to be demolished as the FAA has equipment to be removed and fuel system equipment to be moved from it; Work still to be done inside the new maintenance hangar; grading will be done after old FBO is demolished; new airport sign will be placed, and the hole has been dug. Rollie announced that the next Thursday evening FBO cook out will be Thursday, Sept 21st. Kevin Wheeler will be cooking again.

Fly-out Report: The fly-out of September 16th was to Pickaway County Memorial Airport, CYO at Circleville, Ohio, for their Rollie says ten planes and fourteen people took part in the fly-out. It was a record fly-out and a great time and everything was free! Also, Rollie says gas at CYO was only \$5.50/gal.

On the evening of the 22nd one of our regular, non-chapter member YE pilots came through and saved the day. Chapter pilots Rollie Bailey (499), Bill Corban (445) and Bernie Volpe (154), could have handled the demand but the participation of a fourth pilot, Chris Johnson (56), took the pressure off and made it a more relaxed affair. In the end we had about 25% no-show and flew just 41 kids; Rollie flew 12, Bill flew 9, Bernie flew 9 and Chris flew 11. As coordinator I must apologize to Rollie for not getting him one more kid to fly. I didn't realize he was just one shy of 500! Some of the kids, especially the CAP cadets had multiple flights but the online registration program (YEDay.org) does not credit multiple flights and multiple pilots.
