<u>Update on Mike Duggan's project that was presented to the Chapter</u> during our meeting in July, 2012:

Well, I'm coming up on the two year point of my <u>RANS S-19</u> project and I am happy to say that I am still building and still enjoying the challenge. I recently completed the airframe which was a major milestone; it looks like an airplane instead of a bunch of parts. I will now start to install the systems. I decided on the Dynon SkyView system including the newly introduced radio and intercom. The engine will be the 100 hp Rotax 912ULS.

I have been very pleased with the quality of the S-19 kit. It is a bit of a challenge at points but I think anybody with determination and a little aptitude will get it done and experience that great feeling of accomplishment. There is still a lot of work to be done but I think I can see the light at the end of the tunnel.

<u>Safety Tips</u>

I read the FAA Pilot Safety Tip about taxi clearances in last month's newsletter. It said that we are all student pilots and to always be careful when taxiing on an airport. It's true – a few years ago, after landing a 757 at JFK airport we got a complex string of taxi instructions to our arrival gate. The controller was busy, in a hurry, and had to move us from one end of the airport to another via a circuitous route around traffic and construction. He had the typical New Yorker accent with rapid-fire delivery and numerous flight crews had to ask for repeat instructions. Things were getting more tense and less efficient on the radio when he blasted us with taxi instructions that sounded like an over-caffeinated dyslexic reciting the alphabet. Not wanting a nose-to nose with another airliner and needing to defuse the situation, I said with a timid voice, "JFK Ground, Red Rock 517. I'm a student pilot – could you give us our taxi instructions slower?" There was a pause, then a snort of laughter from the ground controller. Slowly and clearly he read us our routing and we taxied without mistake to our gate. He continued with a slower delivery, everyone's tension level dropped on the radio, and efficiency and safety were improved. I think he learned the adage that to make things go fast on the radio, go slow. I learned that humor and humility help deflate a bubble of tension. We're all students. Sometimes we need to be reminded.


