ELEVATION: 1462'. Traffic pattern altitude 2500' (1038' AGL).

RUNWAY 5-23: 5200' x 100' asphalt; medium intensity runway lights.

Rwy 23: VASI (V2L), right traffic.

COMMUNICATIONS: CTAF/Unicom 122.7 Mhz.

FUEL AVAILABLE: Texaco 100LL and Jet A.


