After the business portion of the meeting Mr. Ed Gassman will give a talk about some of his experiences with aircraft and aircraft systems testing, and flight crew interaction with new systems. He has over 18,000 flight hours and holds type ratings in the DC-10, B-747, B-737, and several others, as well as ATP, CFII, and flight engineer certificates. Ed has been responsible for certification of Presidential aircraft, and has over 900 flight hours testing the 747 modifications for carrying the space shuttle. He is a retired Colonel, USAF.

It should be an interesting meeting - hope to see you there!




