This month we are pleased to have one of our members, *Bo LeMay*, speak to us about some of his missions flying for the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR) which conducts atmospheric studies in many parts of the world. NCAR has its research facilities located in Boulder with flight operations conducted from KBJC. Bo is retired Air Force and flies both the C-130 and Gulf-

stream V for NCAR. Some of his missions have included atmospheric sampling in extreme temperature conditions over Antarctica and, more recently, dropping radiosondes around two hurricanes (Madeline and Lester) in the Pacific. This will be a very interesting talk and I hope you can all make it.



Phil Brown

Phil Brown is a Lifetime EAA member with his first Oshkosh in 1976 after he finished his first homebuilt, an AX-5 hot air balloon. He has been a continuous member since, and has attended 39 Oshkosh/AirVentures. He has volunteered at Oshkosh for most of the last ten years.
