We are pleased to have Victor Vaughn as our speaker for the April 11th Chapter 43 meeting. Victor is a retired Navy Lieutenant Commander with 26 years of service and will be talking about his experiences as related to shipboard aviation operations. He has been stationed on three aircraft carriers, the last as the air traffic officer directing three carrier operations in the Persian Gulf for the last Iraq war. Victor will brief us on aircraft operations to and from the carrier and follow up with a short brief on how the three carriers conducted simultaneous flight operations during the Iraq war. He is currently working in the training department at Denver TRACON.

Victor's wife, Susan, a retired Navy Chief Petty Officer, will also be joining him for his presentation. Susan is currently the Air Traffic Manager at the Front Range Air Traffic Control Tower so hopefully we will have an opportunity to ask her questions about operations at Front Range Airport.

I joined a group of friends on the last Saturday in March, with my Thorp T-18, and we had a nice flight to Salida.

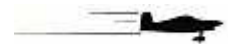


That's Mt. Shavano in the background - one of 54 peaks in Colorado over 14,000' MSL.

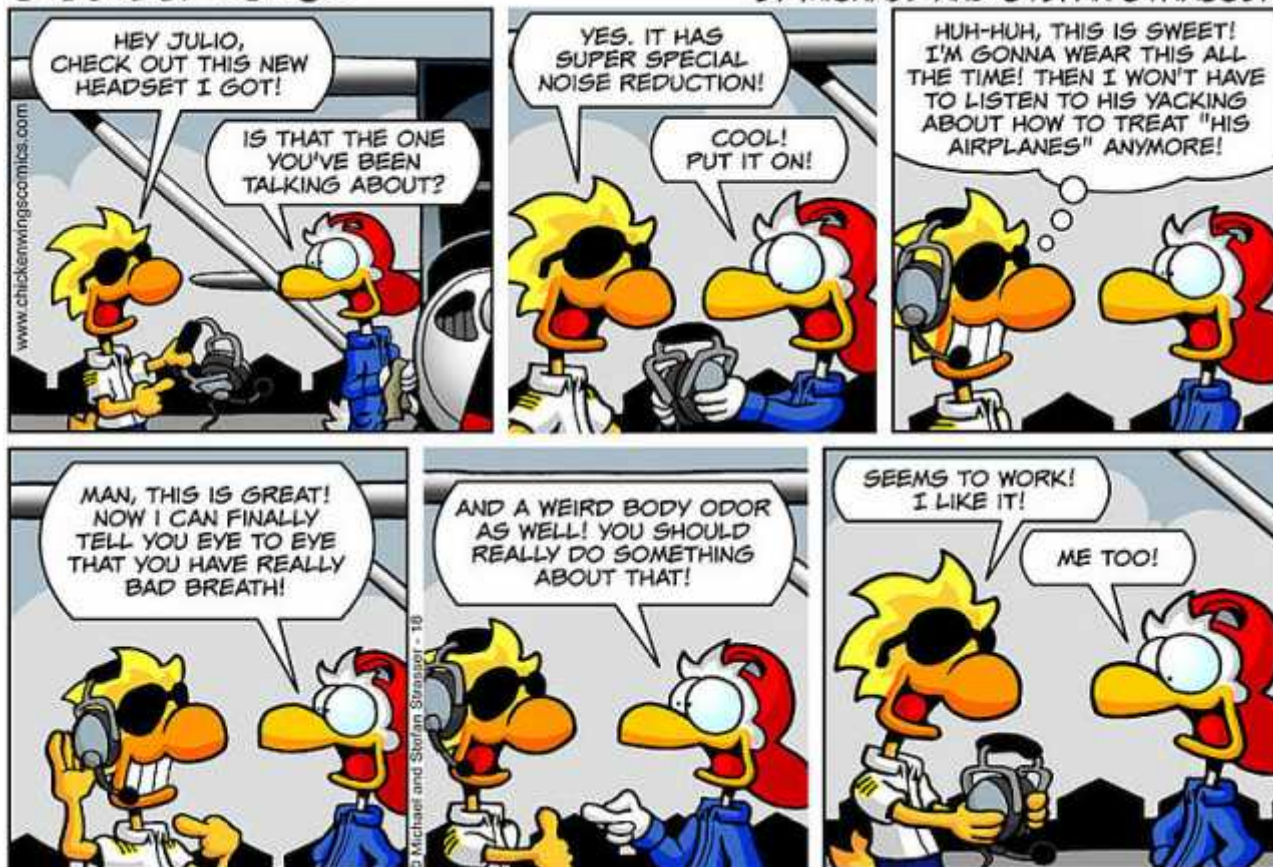

There are two VERY IMPORTANT items for families traveling to Oshkosh

First, one of our gracious mom volunteers sent out a spreadsheet earlier including the list of people planning to volunteer at KidVenture with the B25. The EAA needs a final list. Specifically, each family members name. If you don't have the spreadsheet, it is attached. The contact to add or correct a volunteer is jamiekellogg4@gmail.com We also need this info so that we can be in contact with our team while in Wisconsin.

Second, if you are planning to camp at Scholler, we need your info. WE HAVE TO GIVE A FINAL COUNT TO THE EAA by April 15. Below is the text from an email that was sent to me.

The camping is reserved by campsite. CONTACT NAME needs to let headquarters know how many sites will be needed by KidVenture by the middle to end of April. The Young Aviators had originally anticipated that seven campsites would probably be enough to handle everyone that wanted to stay in Camp Scholler. That is the number that are currently using in the requirements. If the number is more than that than we will need to see if we can get more spots.

A campsite is 20'x30' so seven will give the group a total area of 4200 sq. ft. You can get a lot of campers in that area provided there aren't too many vehicles. Each site is allowed one car pass but each vehicle takes up a fair amount of space. There is some parking at the main gate where cars can be parked and we can probably make some arrangements for spots out there but we need to know how many might be best. Note: Unfortunately the 'hook-up' sites are not part of the area that we can reserve for free camping. They have become very popular over the last couple of years and fill very fast. They have added a large number of water and electrical hook-up areas but I can't tell you how they operate. That information should be available on the AirVenture website at:

We do need to know who we should put down for each campsite. Each site that is reserved by KidVenture needs to have a name attached to it of an active EAA Member and their membership number. The list, that you already have, shows more than seven members with EAA numbers so that requirement won't be a problem. Just let me know which names we should use.

Please note the comments regarding hookups and the location of the online reference. If you need to change your plans based on this... NOW is the time. My interpretation is that if you want hookups, you are on your own.
