## Our Next Meeting:

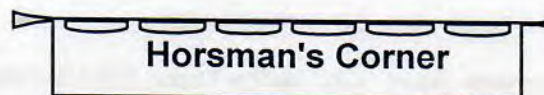

## YOUNG EAGLE RALLY

Chapter 43 will be hosting a Young Eagle Rally for our next meeting in support of the International Young Eagle Rally Day. Pilots have been lined up and many of

you volunteered your time at the last meeting.

To say that we would like the whole chapter to participate is an understatement. A large amount of ground support is needed to ensure a successful rally. Glen Grove and Herrill Davenport have put in hours of their time coordinating and soliciting help. They still need additional helpers on the ground and at least three people that could coordinate the following functions:

**Flightline Administration:** Watches over the flightline for safety and loading/unloading of Young Eagles. Glen will handle this if work does not keep him away from the rally.

**Scheduling & Certificate Coordinator:** This position ensures that the Young Eagles are checked in and that each one gets their certificate.

**Hanger Activities:** This person will assist with getting the young people familiar with how an

aircraft operates and what makes it fly. A basic pre-flight with detailed explanations of the aircraft components works very well.

Emphasis should be placed on the fact that these people will be helping with the coordination of the volunteers not actually doing all of the work (at least that is the concept). Many chapter members are still needed just to help out and if your better half would like to join in the fun they are more than welcome.

A briefing for all of the volunteers and pilots will take place at 8:30am at Tri-County. The coordinators can use all of the help that they can get starting around 8:00 to set-up the area. The location will be at the south end of the tiedown area. This is a large open space so if anyone has a sun canopy or table that they can bring, they can be put to good use.

We are anticipating flying the first kids around 9:00am and ending by 1:00pm. The hope is that a barbecue will be going and the volunteers can stick around after the Young Eagles have left and enjoy some of the same activities as last month. Maybe we can get some of the ground bound chapter members up for a ride in aircraft that they have not had a chance to experience before.

If you are inviting friends to bring their kids out please make sure they understand that strict supervision is needed around the area to maintain safety. Also, if anyone has stachions or stakes and ropes to barricade 'off limits' areas please bring them along. Don't forget your lawn chair if you want to sit down and take a breather.

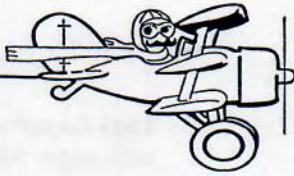
