

I have also spoken with Scott Morin on getting the water and sewer installed from the City of Kingsford's utility connection points into the hangar. I have not spoken with Scott Doda, but last we talked he was anxious to start on roughing in the electrical as well. First on the chapter work list is to get the rest of the interior walls roughed in and then call Dane at the Construction Code Office for a "Rough in Inspection". I spoke to him during my visit with Dale and the Plumbing Inspector and he has been totally understanding of the extended time line to having that inspection, acknowledging we are working mostly with volunteer labor. I'm hoping to work it out with Pete D. on any possible time he might be available that works with my schedule and then I will communicate any work sessions we put together for further hangar construction.

On another note as far as hangar construction, I was trying to secure a DC-3 that was recently hosted in the AOPA Pilot Magazine and referenced the organization to look at our Facebook page and Website. After suggesting that, I checked both sites finding we were late on newsletters on both, and our website is pretty weak with information and interesting pictures or other stuff. Mike and Bryan have both gotten their respective sites current, but Mike can't get pictures and other interesting stuff on the site if it's not sent to him. This morning I sent more "Member Airplanes" to get that folder more updated. Please "HELP US" get more pictures of your planes!! I will start reaching out to specific members over the next couple months to get that part of our website really looking good! I'm hoping to have signage up on the hangar by that time as well. We're definitely hoping for a good turnout for the dedication.

# Editor's Section


