I ordered a pair of cordless mic's for our PA system, so hopefully I don't have to rely and on my brother borrowing me mic's any more. I ordered over fifty printed 5" x 7"pictures I had on my phone of the hangar construction and we are starting a collage showing the different stages of the construction for the public and membership to view during this event and for FAD as well. Please come out and show your support for both Steve, and appreciation for the hard work your membership has put forth on this momentous project.

David Pasahow has been working hard getting EAA to bring us in some unique aircraft for Ford Airport Day. Tim Howen has been coordinating with us as to changes in layout based on construction projects and also in bringing in aircraft for the museum display planned for the newest county hangar (which will be a draw for FAD as well). I've run into a dead end on the Helicopter coming from Duluth, after three communications and no real interest due to changes in their business model. As mentioned above, the loss of Bryan Granholt leaves us with no real future for a Young Eagles Coordinator. Scott expressed to me he definitely wants out, but will help with the transition of that position to a new candidate. Thanks Scott for your dedication to this position over the years for our Chapter!


