

From Frances Englund, Ray Scolarship Coordinator:

Since 2020, EAA Chapter 44 has applied to EAA national to be approved to offer a Ray Foundation Aviation Scholarship. For three years in a row, we have been awarded the honor of mentoring and guiding a youth who has been active in our chapter toward earning their PPL. The BOD has once again submitted the chapter's application to be able to have one of our youth apply for 2023. We should know if Chapter 44 was chosen by the end of February.

For the past 3 years, the maximum a Scholar could receive through the Ray Aviation Scholarship was \$10,000. Through the generosity of the Ray Foundation, each candidate will be eligible for a maximum of \$11,000 in 2023.

Since the beginning of the Ray Scholarship being offered, Lightspeed has offered to give each scholar a Zulu 3 headset once the Scholar solos. Lightspeed has once again committed to this offer.

Our Ray Scholar for 2022 is Sharon Reithel, As we all know, the weather over the past two months has not been exactly VFR. As you will read separately, Sharon is very frustrated in not getting to fly. When you see her, please give her some encouraging words.

"The 1st meeting of the "Rochester Area E.A.A." was held on February 25, 1958 at Hylan Field *(now Marketplace Mall.)* The purpose and aims of EAA were explained to the group. A count of EAA members at the meeting was insufficient to make application for a charter but many expressed interest in doing so. Brochures and membership forms were handed out. A progress report on current building projects was given. Pictures of the '57 Fly-in were shown and "Hylan passed the apples."

From those humble beginnings, we now have, and are, an aviation education center for Western New York and the Finger Lakes Region. 
