YOUNG EAGLE RALLYS OFFER FREE FLIGHTS TO KIDS AGES 8-17 JULY 9, AUGUST 13

In 1993 the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) launched a monumental endeavor to introduce 1,000,000 young people ages 8-17 to aviation by giving them a free airplane ride. This summer the 2,000,000 Young Eagle will get his/her ride at EAA's annual convention and airshow, AirVenture. To say that the program has been a smashing success is an understatement. Many former Young Eagles go on to attain their pilots



license and a career in aviation.

EAA Chapter 44 has been actively involved in Young Eagles since the inception of the program. We have flown close to 2,000 kids ourselves. Young Eagle Coordinator Elise Isler recruits volunteer pilots and their planes for a day of one-on-one rides about 20-30 minutes long.

YOUNG EAGLE AVIATION CAMP AUGUST 8-12

EAA Chapter 44 provides a summer aviation camp at the Sport Aviation Center for young people ages 13-16. This is an all-day all week (9 AM-4 PM Monday thru Friday) day camp focusing on a variety of aviation topics and activities. The cost is \$225.



Campers will be exposed to Rochester aviation history, take airport tours of the Brockport and Rochester airports, build and fly a model plane, participate in 3 aircraft-material building workshops (metal, fiberglass, and wood), flight planning and navigation, drones, careers, and more.

At the end of the camp the chapter holds a separate Young Eagle Rally open to the public that they can sign up for.

SAFETY SEMINARS PROVIDED TWICE A YEAR TO AVIATION COMMUNITY




