EARL LUCE PRESENTS HIS EAA WELDING VIDEO

ITALIAN SAUSAGE SOUP RECIPE provided by Darryl & Ginny Byers

At last months meeting Darryl and Ginny Byers provided their annual entre' of Italian Sausage Soup. It WAS delicious wasn't it! So many of you asked for the recipe that they have offered it here. Bon Appetit'!

Ingredients

1 lb Italian sausage, casings removed

1 medium to large onion, diced or minced (I added this)

1 garlic clove, minced (yeah, right! 2 to 4 more like it!)

2 (14 ounce) cans beef broth

1 (14 ½ ounce) can Italian-style stewed tomatoes 1 cup carrots, sliced

1 (14 ½ ounce) can Great Northern beans (or cannellini), undrained

2 small zucchini, cubed (I like to use 1 zuke and 1 yellow summer squash)

2 cups Baby Spinach, packed, rinsed and torn (I use a can of spinach)

1/4 tsp ground pepper (fresh!) or to taste

¹/₄ tsp salt, or to taste (I don't use any)

Also, couple handfuls of acini di pepe, ditalini, orzo, or other small pasta. (I added this, too)

Directions

- 1. In Dutch oven (stockpot, whatever) brown sausage with onions & garlic. Break up sausage.
- 2. Stir in broth, tomatoes and carrots, season with salt & pepper.
- 3. Bring to boil, reduce heat, cover and allow to simmer for 15 minutes.
- 4. Stir in beans with their liquid and zucchini.
- 5. Cover and simmer another 15 minutes, or until zucchini is tender.
- 6. Remove from heat, stir in spinach.
- 7. Cover and allow spinach to cook in the steam from the soup for another 5 minutes or until tender.

How I do it:

- 1. Pour a glass of wine!
- 2. Ideally, prep all the veggies. If this requires more wine, so be it.
- 3. I brown the sausage with the onions & garlic. When it is almost done, I like to throw in the carrots and let them cook in there to bring out a bit of their sugars. I also put the fresh ground black pepper in during browning.
- 4. Put in the broth, tomatoes, beans, can of spinach, and the zuke/squash. Stir.
- 5. Cover and let simmer for a while. Drink wine.
- 6. Throw in a couple handfuls of acini di pepe and stir. Cover and let simmer some more.
- Slice Italian bread
- 8. Serve! We like to put a squeeze of lime in it, and some Parmesan cheese. Italian bread with butter! More wine!

take EAA or other on-line webinars;


take a \$100 hamburger winter flight with a friend. You clean the wings;
